IN MEMORIAM

MRS. D.J. MacCORMACK

The community of Georgetown and surrounding country was saddened on Saturday, February 15, when it became known that Mrs. Daniel J. MacCormack, a dearly beloved and highly esteemed resident of the town had passed to her eternal reward. She was in her eighty-sixth year.

The former Annie L. Morrison, she was born at Port Hood, Inverness Co., Cape Breton and was one of a family of seven, of the late Peter and Mary (MacDonnell) Morrison. She moved to Georgetown with her parents at the age of five where she spent her girlhood.

Sixty-three years ago she married Daniel J. MacCormack, Post Master of Bourgetown Island. After her husband's death nineteen years ago she became post mistress, a position which she held until she moved to Georgetown ten years ago.

Mrs. MacCormack was a woman of many sterling qualities, sincere, upright and honest. She was always willing to sacrifice her time where loving sympathy and kindly deeds were needed. She had a tender love for the poor and needy and unfortunate and was always ready to assist them in their trials.

No higher tribute can be paid to the truly Christian mother than the recognition of one of her most outstanding virtues: charity; for the love of God she went forth in all her actions.

Countless times she administered to the sick and the dying. The number of children who paid their last respects was evidence of the love she had for them. The door of her home was always open to the stranger or wayfarer and countless numbers found warmth and food and rest within her home.

She was a woman deeply religious and through her great love for prayer and the sacraments was always prepared to meet her Redeemer.

Within the family circle she was ever the centre of the prayer life which penetrated the homely joys and sorrows of the household. She had a great love for the family Rosary which was repeated each night in the home. It was to her home on Bourgetown Island that the neighbors came to assist at Mass, when the parish priest came to minister to the aged. For years she was promoter for the League of the Sacred Heart for that Community.

In the latter years of her life, her prayers ascended almost incessantly to the Throne of God. The last rites of the Catholic Church were administered by Rev. Fr. Gallant of Cardigan due to the absence of Rev. Owen Kiggins. The funeral which was under the direction of the Montague Funeral Parlor took place to St. Georges Church, St. Georges, on Monday, February 17th, where Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Bennett MacDonal her former pastor. Rev. Owen Kiggins occupied a seat in the sanctuary. The Mass was sung by the male choir.

All that was mortal of a good neighbor, a kind follower, a generous and loving mother was laid to rest. Services at the grave were conducted by Rev. Bennett MacDonal, assisted by Rev. Owen Kiggins. The ladies choir was in attendance at the graveside.

Left to mourn and cherish the memory of a loving and devoted mother are three sons and two daughters namely: John J. Personnel Manager, Usen Fisheries, Souris, P.E.I. Daniel A. teacher in Georgetown High School and Frank C., Georgetown; Genevieve (Mrs. James D. Lanigan, Cambridge, P.E.I. and (Mary), Mrs. Patrick Giddings of Cambridge and Lower Montague. Also surviving is one sister, Mrs. John F. Lightizer of Charlottetown; thirteen grandchildren and nineteen great grandchildren.
