SEIGNIORY CLUB, Que., March 20 (CP)—Lower prices within the next few months for Canadian butter, milk and cheese, were forecast today by a National Dairy Council economist.
Blake A. Campbell of Ottawa said in an address before the Council's annual meeting that this decline in domestic prices may be brought about by lower costs for hired help and dairy feeds.
The price drops, he said, speaking as one of a four-man symposium, will mean less money for Canadian farmers, cutting deep into their power to purchase goods produced by other industries.
The symposium marked the first discussion stage of the Council's three-day annual meeting. Some 200 delegates are attending.
Taking part in the symposium along with Mr. Campbell were George Patterson, director of agricultural marketing for the Federal Trade Department; W. C. Cameron, chairman of the Agriculture Department's Dairy Board, and J. P. Coyle of Toronto, president of the Canadian Company of Canada.
Surveying the foreign front, Mr. Patterson said that with the exception of cheese, there is little hope of selling other dairy products to the United Kingdom this year.
Mr. Coyle reviewed his recent trip to Australia and other South-Pacific points and noted lightly that Mr. Patterson had left the Council with the feeling that there was nothing but a "pious hope" for Canada in foreign markets.
As the conference opened, the biggest worry of the Canadian dairy industry, as expressed by J. H. Duplan, the Council's president, is the cut in butter sales caused by the growth in margarine production.
Emphasis swung to price-support and its future as L. W. Pearsall, the Agriculture Department's director of marketing, said that the Government's price-support policy is mainly to help food-growing industries readjust to current marketing conditions.
Mr. Pearsall's address, read in his absence by Mr. Cameron, indicated further that the Government may have to invoke production controls and marketing problems by itself.

WATER POWER RESOURCES

OTTAWA, March 21 (CP)—Canada has a feasible turbine installation potential of more than 55,000 horsepower, Resources Minister Winters reported today in a review of the Dominion's water power resources. The currently recorded waterpower resources of Canada including the new province of Newfoundland, total 97,000 horsepower under conditions of low stream flow the Review said. At average flow they total almost 43,000 horsepower, a figure which represents a "feasible turbine installation of over 56,000 horsepower."
