Island a valuable cabinet of shells collected from the Gulf and River St.
Lawrence by the late Admiral Bayfield, during his survey of these waters.
The collection is one of the most interesting in these Provinces as it
represents the various sections of the wide field covered by the Admiralty
Survey. It contains a large number of specimens of each of the seventy-
six species represented, and exhibits these in their many forms and
varieties."

1 Arthropoda, 65 Mollusca, 3 Echinodermata, 1 Protozoa (sponge), 1 Algae
and 24 fossils.

Clark feeder in Indian River: (Feb. 10) 6 Canada Goose (1 with a broken wing), 1 Goshawk (Jan. 21), 2 Merlin (Feb. 8), 1 Ruffed Grouse (Feb. 7), 5 Mourning Dove, 2 Hairy Woodpecker (Dec. 9 - Jan. 10), 2 Downy Woodpecker, 5 Common Crow, 24 Black-capped Chickadee, 1 Robin (Feb. 3-6), 12 House Sparrow, 9-10 Common Grackle (passing through on Jan. 26), 85 Evening Grosbeak, 2 Purple Finch, 6 Dark-eyed Junco, 3 Red Squirrel (TC).

West feeder in Lewis Point: (Feb. 1) 15 Gray Partridge (about Feb. 10), 2 Hairy Woodpecker, 2 Downy Woodpecker, 3 Blue Jay, 4 Common Crow, 3-4 Black-capped Chickadee, White-breasted Nuthatch (2 on Jan. 18, 1 on Jan. 30), 6 Evening Grosbeak (Jan. 28), 3 Red Squirrel (AW, MW).
