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Takeovers Again Featured In Canadian Business Field

Interest on the Canadian business scene centred in Toronto last week and takeovers again were in the spotlight.
The latest takeover attempt to sweep financial circles—Gunnar Mining Ltd. for McNamara Corp.—stirred rumors the like of which have not been heard for some time.
Rumors of threats of the Gunnar junction split among the company directors, swirled in a whirlpool of mystery.
On Tuesday Gunnar—one of Canada's biggest uranium mining companies—announced plans to purchase McNamara for \$16,000,000—half in cash and half from the issuance of 600,000 Gunnar shares at \$10 each. McNamara is a family-owned Toronto-based heavy construction firm with contracts currently in excess of \$100,000.

DEFERRED ACTION

The same day, the Toronto Stock Exchange, which must approve the issuance of the treasury shares—deferred approval pending further information deemed necessary to reach a decision.
An official of the exchange said it felt that such a transaction of this magnitude should be subject to shareholders approval and hoped that this could be arranged.

The following day reports circulated that Gunnar would seek shareholders approval if necessary. In fact, Gunnar president, denied this and said the situation had not changed. He added that the agreement insisted upon by McNamara, was completed by a resolution of the Gunnar board of directors.
On Friday it was rumored that Charles LaBine, an uncle of the present and former president and vice-president of the company, threatened court action to block the proposed takeover, saying Gunnar didn't need the McNamara company and that it would only "hobble" shareholders.

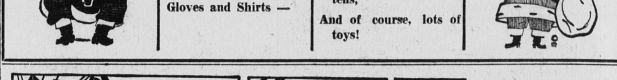

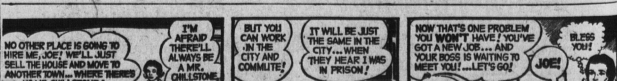
