

General Strike Being Urged In Morocco

RABAT, Morocco (AP)—Nationalist leaflets Monday urged a general strike next week in Casablanca, the restless commercial capital of the protectorate, putting new pressure on the French in their race for a Moroccan settlement.

Far from Morocco in a mountain resort of distant Madagascar, France took an important stride toward such a settlement when Gen. Georges Catroux paid an official call on Morocco's pro-nationalist former sultan, Mohammed Ben Youssef.

It was the first time that an important Frenchman had met with Ben Youssef since the day two years ago when French officers in Rabat deposed him and sent him into exile. Catroux's reported mission is to obtain Ben Youssef's approval for a new French policy of co-operation with the moderate nationalists instead of their suppression.

The meeting closed by singing "The Queen."

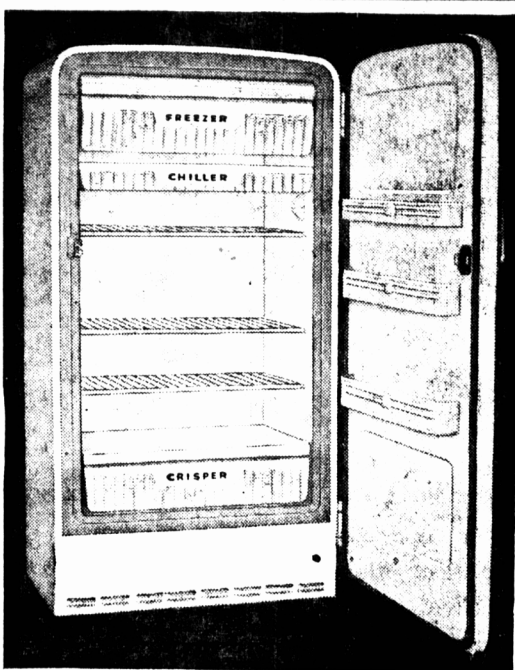
CIVIL SERVANT RETIRES

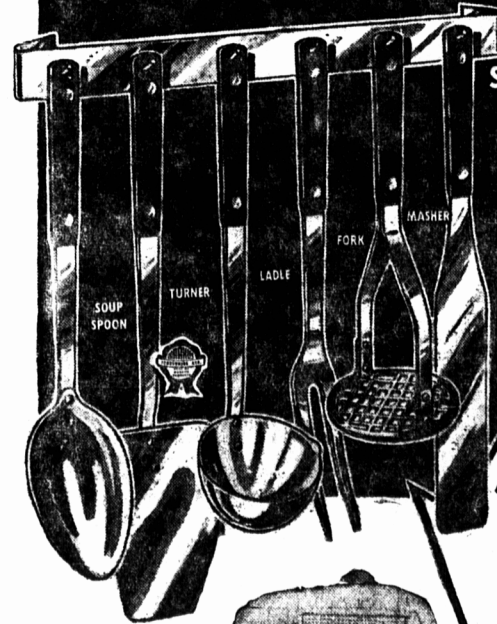

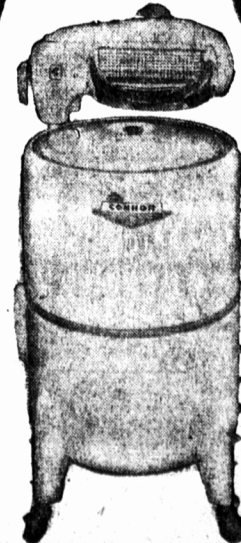
