WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Island stands prorogued until Thursday, the Twenty-eighth day of May next: I have thought fit, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued until **THURSDAY**, the Second day of **JULY** next, of which all persons concerned are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
