1. Two spades. In responding to partner's takeout double, care must be taken to distinguish a good hand from a poor one. Since the responder may have a worthless hand when he replies to the double, he is under obligation to identify a good one when he has it. This he does by making a skip bid instead of a minimum bid.

If a response of one spade were made on this hand, the doubler would have no way of knowing that a 10-point hand, including a good five card suit and a singleton, was facing him. A sound game contract might be missed as a result. As a general rule, the responder makes a jump bid

**Clergy Alarmed At Drift From Prairie Farms**

OTTAWA (CP) — A Roman Catholic parish priest from Saskatchewan told the federal cabinet Tuesday that clergy of all denominations are alarmed at the rate families are leaving prairie farms.

"We would wholeheartedly endorse any reasonable measure that will promote the welfare of the family farm," said Rev. George Walliser of Dilke, Sask.

He was acting as spokesman for 12 clergymen who accompanied the 1,000-member prairie delegation seeking grain deficiency payments. He was one of several who presented supplementary briefs as Prime Minister Diefenbaker and his cabinet met the delegation.

Father Walliser said western clergy "are also alarmed by the general feeling of discouragement that is creeping over the people who are still left on the farm."

"Many young people have no hope of ever taking up farming. They have no choice but to leave home at an early age and crowd into the cities, adding to the problem of unemployment and the consequent moral evils."

Canadians had a moral obligation to the overcrowded peoples of the world and "we can not in conscience allow our rural areas to be depopulated at a time when millions of people are looking for a place to settle."


