NEW YORK (AP) — Floyd Patterson, former heavyweight boxing champion, is selling his home in a fashionable section of New York because no one wanted to play with his children, the New York Post says.

"There have been incidents. People have called my kids 'nigger,' 'sambo,' and 'black,'" the newspaper quoted Patterson as saying.

He bought the 11-room home in suburban Yonkers in 1961 for \$140,000 and has offered to sell it for \$120,000.

Patterson and his wife have four children, ranging from two to seven.

Patterson was not available for comment on the Post story, but his lawyer, Julius November, said the former champion had put his home up for sale. He said Patterson had come to the conclusion he wanted his family closer to his training quarters.

NO PARTICULAR PROBLEMS
The Y.M.C.A. whose pool uses about 80,000 gallons of water said that they have "no problem" as the pool's water is used again and again, by a purifying system.

SIEMENS LAUNDRIES reported that pressure was down, but there was no shortage of water and the leak caused no great problems to their operations.

Chairman of the Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply, Sidney Green at midnight said that the cooperation of the Water Department staff was "truly remarkable." He said that every member of the staff had worked continuously since 6 o'clock yesterday morning and were on their way to start shutting water off in various sections of the city at that time.

Finally Mr. Green stated that the situation was not a long lasting one, and that he hoped every citizen would do his part in conserving water.

Harness Racing At Blue Bonnets

MONTREAL (CP) — Harness racing starts Sunday at Blue Bonnets Raceway in west-end Montreal following settlement of a dispute between the track and race horse owners over the size of purses.

The track announced Friday that the horses have a satisfactory latest offer — 43 per cent of the track's net — per cent share of purse and betting.

The horses got 40 per cent last season and had been holding out for a larger share this year. The harness racing season was to have started April 3.
