BALANCE OF TRADE.

In the fiscal year 1896 Canada's exports exceeded its imports by \$3,002,344.

In the fiscal year 1899 Canada's imports exceeded its exports by \$5,637,872.

That is, in the last year of the Conservative rule the balance of trade was \$3,002,344 in favor of Canada, and in the last year of Liberal rule the balance of trade was \$5,637,872 against us.

While there has thus been on balance a turn of \$8,640,216 against us, how has the trade of the United States fared?

In 1896 the foreign balance in favor of that country was \$85,477,813.

In 1900 that country's exports of merchandise amounted to \$1,370,476,158, and its imports to \$849,714,670, making the stupendous balance in its favor of \$520,751,488.

In other words, while our imports last year showed an excess of \$5,673,872 over our exports, the United States exports on the other hand showed an excess of \$520,751,488 over that country's imports.
