Gambling Leader Found Guilty Of Tax Evasion

LOS ANGELES, June 23—(AP)—Mickey Cohen, whose pudgy figure was spotlighted by the Kefauver Senate crime investigation probe, was convicted today of Federal income-tax evasion.

Denied bail, he was taken to jail to await sentencing July 9. A jury convicted him on four counts. The maximum on the counts is 20 years in Federal prison and \$40,000 in fines. Cohen, New York-born but a Los Angeles resident most of his 37 years, was accused in three counts of evading \$166,123 in taxes for the years 1946-48. The fourth accused him of making a false statement to the Government.

It was his first conviction on a major charge in a lifetime on the edge of the law. He has escaped gunmen's bullets, assassins' bombs and criminal charges with equal ease.

Cohen took the verdict silently. Nearby was his pretty wife, Lavonne, originally charged with him because she signed the joint

income-tax returns. The Government dropped its case against her in mid-trial, however, saying she apparently knew little of his affairs.

The jury foreman said "All doubts were dissipated by the reading of the testimony of John O'Rourke." The Florida gambler said he quit doing business with Cohen after losing \$83,000 to him in two years. Cohen claimed his winnings from O'Rourke were only \$16,000 to \$18,000.

The verdict bore out Cohen's own prediction. He said he was innocent, but "the word is out to get Mickey Cohen."

In 1934, he was convicted of embezzling \$2,900 in Cleveland and escaped with a suspended two-year sentence. In 1941, he served six months here for book-making.

He was looked upon here in many quarters as the rackets successor to Benjamin (Bugsy) Siegel, slain in nearby Beverly Hills in 1947. But Cohen himself disclaimed this.

The Liberals chose J. Mel Moffatt, former mayor of Galt, Ont., and loser to Mr. Homuth by 300 votes in the general election. Mrs. James (Peggy) Geens of Preston, Ont., is the C. C. F. candidate. In general election the vote was: Mr. Homuth, 8,740; Mr. Moffatt, 8,397; and Paul Dufresne, C.C.F., 5,425.

Two candidates are contesting Brandon, made vacant through the death of J. E. Matthews, Liberal member from 1938. J. W. Grant MacEwan, 48, is running for the Liberals, and Walter Dinsdale, 48, for the Progressive Conservatives. Both are university men. Mr. MacEwan resigned as dean of agriculture at the University of Manitoba to contest the seat. Mr. Dinsdale is assistant professor of social science at Brandon College.

In the last election, Mr. Matthews polled 11,263 votes. John Bracken, former Progressive Conservative leader, got 7,150 and D. L. Johnson, an Independent, 1,964. Three candidates are in the field in Winnipeg South Centre.

Stock Market Prices Decline In New York

NEW YORK, June 24—(AP)—On the eve of the first anniversary of the Korean war, the stock market declined. Last week the market fell in four days out of five. There was confusion in the market from congressional debate over controls. Restrictions proposed on economic controls to curb inflation evoked predictions that the cost of living would go racing up again, if the proposals become law.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined \$1.90 to \$91.40, only \$2 above the low for the year. One outstanding characteristic of last week's market was volume. Business contracted to 5,710,000 shares, as compared with 6,158,000 shares the previous week when the market was rising.

There was no runaway tendency on the downside during any session. Short rallies were frequent, and many times those gains held.
