## Strange But True

On the night of May 30, 1813, black-haired Captain May brought his pirate ship, the "May Jane," into the little harbor which bears his name and faces the Bay of Fundy.

Once ashore, these bloodthirsty buccaniers lost no time in stealing the provisions of the nearby French settlement, bringing terror to the hearts of every man, woman and child. And before the "Jolly Roger" had been hoisted and they had sailed away, they left on the shore a chest of gold and the dead bodies of two persons, a beautiful Indian maiden and their own messy boy, who was in love with the dusky maid.

The following morning their bodies were discovered along with the chest which, in their haste to get away, the pirates left unburied. The chest contained enough gold to make every settler rich, but it had been secured with the price of blood and the superstitious people carried it far out on a sand bar and buried it.

Years later a new generation sought the treasure but in vain. The chest of gold is still there, for shortly after the tragedy of May 30, 1813, pirate Captain Hall was captured by a man-o-war in search of vessels flying the "Jolly Roger."

He confessed to the murder of the Indian girl and his own mess boy, and was duly hanged according to the custom of those days.

Kissing first began between kinsmen and kinswomen in order that the former might know whether their wives or daughters had tasted wine; and handshaking came into vogue when the weapon hand was bared and held out as a symbol of peace.

In olden days somebody invented tarring and feathering to punish robbers aboard ships. First, the victim's hair was cropped short, and boiling pitch poured over his dome, and then the feathers of a cushion were shaken out and placed over the hot tar.

When the vessel reached port, the tarred and feathered one was put ashore.

The United States borrowed the 21 gun salute from the British. The origin of the custom has been traced as follows: Originally warships fired a salute of 7 guns, the number 7 being selected because of its mystical significance from antiquity. In those days shore batteries fired three guns to the ship's one.

## Korean Murder Charges Subject Of Court Martial

SEOUL, Korea, Aug. 27.—(Reuters)—A Korean woman told a Canadian court martial yesterday that she discovered her brother-in-law blown to pieces by a hand grenade after a party of Canadian troops had attempted to rape her in the next room.

She said her brother-in-law, a South Korean army lieutenant, and two South Korean civilians were killed by a grenade tossed into the room by the Canadians.

Five others sleeping in the room escaped.

Miss Chun Ok Haw was testifying for the prosecution at the resumed court martial of Pte. Glen R. Blank 27, of Winnipeg, on a charge of murder.

Two other Canadian privates, Donald M. Gibson 22 of Ottawa and Alan R. Montgomery Davis, 24, of Vancouver, face murder counts at separate trials. All three are members of the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry.

The explosion took place at Chung Woon Myon, March 17. Miss Chun's evidence opened yesterday resumed hearings in the temporary courtroom, a bare schoolroom housing the 10th Canadian field punishment camp headquarters.

She said a group of United Nations soldiers came to the billet where she was staying with her friend, Miss Kim Ok Nan.

The soldiers molested the two girls and then drove away in a jeep after throwing a hand grenade into the adjoining room where the men were, she said.

Not Identified  
Miss Chun did not identify any of her assailants.

Cross-examined by defending officer Lt.-Col. J. A. Hutchins, she said she was not raped. She was manhandled but no one tore her clothes.

At Saturday's session, her friend Miss Kim said she "thought she remembered" Blank as one of the group.

Miss Chun said when she heard the grenade exploded she rushed out to hide in a storeroom and of Vermont.

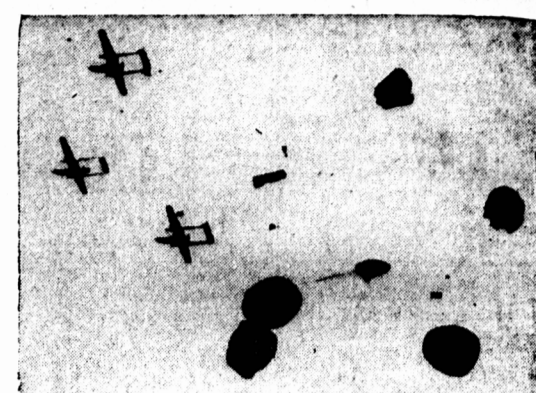

The court called an expert to identify fragments of a hand grenade.

Mr. E. Williams, chief chemist of the United States Far East command criminal investigation laboratory, said they were similar in all observable characteristics to fragments obtained by detonating other grenades supplied to him by the Commonwealth forces.

A South Korean military policeman, who went to the scene next morning, said he found pieces of a grenade and a packet of gold flake cigarettes.

He also found two khaki berets, one carrying a Princess Patricia's badge. The court will resume today.

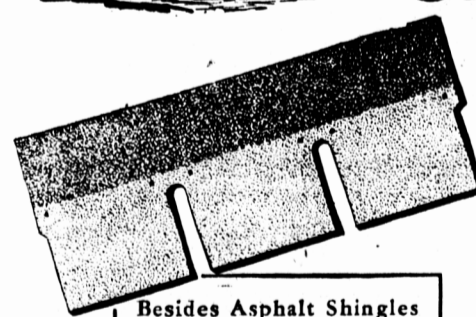

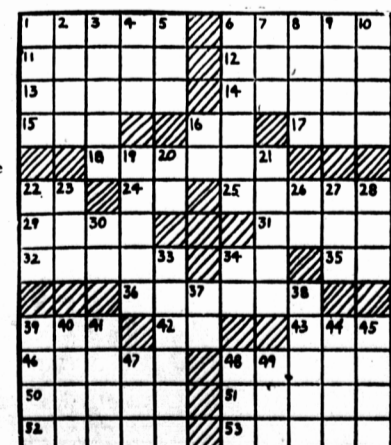
