Canadians Acquire Invest. Syndicate

WINNIPEG, March 20—Investors Syndicate of Canada, Limited has announced that control of the company has been acquired by Canadian investors through the purchase of outstanding common shares by Dominion Securities Corp. Ltd., Webb and Knapp (Canada) Ltd. of Montreal and others, including certain officers and directors of I.S.C.

In making the announcement T. O. Peterson, President of I.S.C. said that a total of more than 390,000 common shares has been sold by the Murchison interests. Alleghany Corporation and others. Of this total, Webb and Knapp (Canada) Ltd. purchased approximately 150,000 common shares from the Murchison interests. A spokesman for Webb and Knapp said the purchase was made for investment.

In addition, a syndicate headed by Dominion Securities Corp. and I.S.C. purchased approximately 215,000 shares of non-voting Class A common stock of I.S.C. now held by Alleghany Corporation and others.

I.S.C. has outstanding 574,549 shares of voting common stock and 991,800 of non-voting Class A common stock.

Mr. Peterson said that the policy management and personnel of I.S.C. would remain unchanged.

He also stated that management of I.S.C. would be encouraged to purchase additional shares in the company.

Investors Syndicate of Canada is engaged in the issuance and distribution of investment certificates and the funds received from this source are invested in mortgages made under the National Housing Act, conventional mortgages, bonds, stocks and certificate loans. I.S.C. also acts as distributor and investment manager for Investors Mutual of Canada Ltd., an affiliated mutual fund.

As of December 31, 1956 I.S.C. had total assets of \$107,065,638 and its affiliate, Investors Mutual, had assets in excess of \$123,000,000.
