HALIFAX (CP) — Windsor Maple Leafs, playing in a slightly lower gear than two men's earlier, drubbed Montreal 6-1 in the second game of the eastern Canada Allan Cup night.

The powerful Maritime representatives were lacking a little of Thursday's edge as they took a 2-0 lead in the best-of-five series. The third and possibly deciding game will be played here tonight.

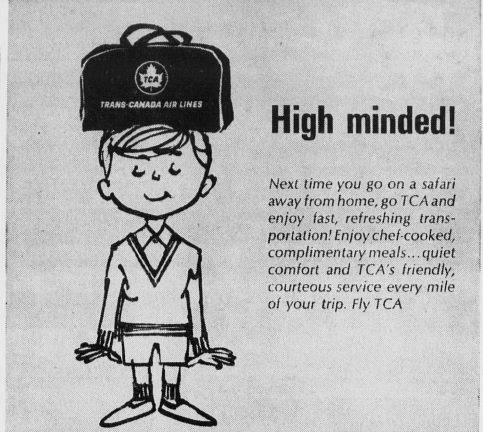

PARKDALE - - - SHERWOOD

Commencement of Garbage Collection and Disposal Service

Parkdale service begins Tuesday March 31, 1964
Sherwood service begins Friday, April 3, 1964

Collections will be made each Tuesday in Parkdale and each Friday in Sherwood until April 30th. After April 30th both Parkdale and Sherwood Garbage will be pick up on Tuesday and Friday.

Pick-ups will be made at the back doors of residences or establishments, Collectors will not open any doors or climb any stairs to pick up Garbage. At a n y household or establishment having a lane or driveway over two hundred feet in length, the garbage will be picked up from a point in driveway or lane two hundred feet from the road. The amount of garbage that will be collected from any household or establishment is limited to two-to-three cubic yards per unit per week. This is equivalent to thirteen-13-four cubic foot capacity garbage cans. Garbage cans must be of waterproof metallic or plastic construction with a tight cover. Cardboard boxes may also be used providing they are properly secured so they cannot be opened by animals or the weather. Rags or waste impregnated with any combustible material, or any material of an explosive or highly combustible nature will not be picked up.

A complete copy of the By-Law to provide for the collection of garbage and refuse will be delivered to each household and establishment in the near future.
