

Local and Other Items.

BUTTER FACTORY.—A new butter factory is to be established at Bonshaw.

PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE.—The House stands adjourned until three o'clock this afternoon.

A SUNDAY SUM.—The proceeds of an Easter tea and fancy sale in the Guild Room, Summerside, Monday evening, amounted to the handsome sum of \$115.

AT HOME.—Members of the 'Missionary Society and ladies of the congregation of the First Methodist Church are holding an Easter At Home this afternoon in the church parlor.

POTATO SHIPMENTS.—The Summerside correspondent of the Guardian says: It is understood that some of our potato shippers have already received orders from Boston for several car loads of potatoes and in all probability shipments will be made as soon as the Northumberland resumes her regular trip.

NEW BRUNSWICK CHEESE.—The Sussex Record says: Kings county leads the province in the size of its output last year and from present indications the season of 1898 will surpass the previous record. The number of factories which last year was fifteen will this year be increased by six and perhaps more.

SCHOLARSHIP GAINED.—It is announced that at the annual convocation of the Presbyterian College, Montreal, Mr. C. Hardy, of Montrose was awarded the Lord Mount Stephen scholarship. Mr. J. B. McLeod, Sprinoton gained the Stirling scholarship, and Mr. D. M. McLeod, B. A. Springton, the Walter Paul scholarship, each of which is worth \$50.

YUKON TRANSPORTATION.—It is stated that the government of British Columbia are negotiating with a firm of contractors to make a wagon road on the route which was to have been the course of the Mackenzie and Mann railway. It is understood that one whole cabinet sitting since the holidays commenced has been devoted to the question of Yukon transportation roads.

Gallant vs. Mellett.—Trespass lien note signed after delivery of article. Trespass for wrongfully taking from the dwelling house of the plaintiff a cooking stove and thereby causing the plaintiff damage and depriving him of the same.

The evidence proved the entering of the house and the taking of the stove against the plaintiff's will and order.

Defendant pleaded leave and license as a justification, and produced a promissory note of the kind commonly called a lien note, signed by the plaintiff, and overdue and unpaid at the time of taking. The lien clause was as follows: "I further agree to furnish satisfactory security if required. (I am to have immediate possession and use of the article for which this note is given, but the property therein is not to pass to me until full payment of the price, and of any obligations given therefor, or for any part thereof. If I make any default you may resume possession and sell the article to pay the unpaid balance of the price, whether due or not.)"

In rebuttal the plaintiff showed that the lien note had been given for a balance due on the price of stone and had been signed by him seven months after the sale and delivery of the article. He denied being aware that the note was a lien note.

Held that as the note was signed after the sale and delivery of the stove the lien clause therein contained was inoperative so far as the stove was concerned and did not justify the trespass of the defendant.


Judgment for the plaintiff for twenty dollars damages and costs. Arthur Mellish for plaintiff; J. A. Mathieson for defendant.
