Big Three Emerge Victors; Canada, Sweden Today

The big three of Olympic hockey tournament - Canada, Russia and Czechoslovakia - were their opening games with the eighth-championship club series in impressive fashion Wednesday, indicating the fight for the gold medal is wide open.

The young Canadian national team shut out Switzerland 8-0, Russia defeated the United States 2-0, and Czechoslovakia crushed Germany 11-1.

Centre Gary Dineen of Montreal and Roger Bourbonnais of Riviere Claire, Ala., were the Canadian stars. Dineen had two goals and an assist and Bourbonnais a goal and two assists.

Canada meets Sweden today and Switzerland plays Finland in the medal competition. Rev. David Bauer, the Canadian coach, said his squad skated better than they have since they started their Olympic Canadian and Euro team tour, but wasn't satisfied with their marksmanship and that he had pondered Yviss goalie Gerald Riglet with more than a shot a minute.

RIGLET IMPRESSES

Father Bauer singled out Riglet as the star of the Swiss club. Riglet played an outstanding game in making 61 saves, said the Roman Catholic priest. "He is a very sharp shooter."
