**ROYAL RESCRIPT IS ISSUED**

CAIRO, May 23.—Women are excluded from the throne of Egypt under a royal rescript which has been issued establishing the right of succession by primogeniture. Prince Farouk, son of King Faud, was designated as present heir to the throne.

The rescript provides that if the King has no male children, his eldest brother succeeds to the throne.

The Mohamed Ali family are eligible for the throne except the former ex-Khdiva Abbas Hilmi (who was deposed in 1914), but the exclusion does not apply to his descendants.

Each king will secretly nominate three persons as pro-hered but Parliament is allowed the right of approval or change.
