# Sees Provinces in North

MONTREAL (CP) — Prime Minister Diefenbaker said Wednesday night that by the 100th anniversary of Confederation he hopes to be in a position to bring the northern territories into Confederation as provinces.

He told a joint meeting of five Manitoba and Ontario associations that vast developments are taking place all over the north and the provinces in line with the vision for Canada followed by the Conservative party since 1867.

The prime minister received a warm reception from the crowd with the exception of one man in the gallery who shouted "hogwash, hogwash" and left the hall as the prime minister was saying that the object of his government had been to equalize opportunity across the country.

Mr. Diefenbaker, who has yet to indicate what Senate reform measures will be considered as forecast in the three speeches, hinted at the possibility of a fixed period of service.

# Conservation Dredge Alterations Awarded Local Firm

## Constitution Reform Plan Announced For Rhodesia

LONDON (Reuters) — The British government announced Wednesday its long-awaited proposals for reforming the constitution of Northern Rhodesia to give more political power to the Negro majority which has been demanding its full share in the government of the tense protectorate.

The proposals contained involved technicalities, but first intention they went to suit the white minority and not far enough to satisfy the demands of the Negro nationalists.

As yet there was no comment from Sir Roy Fedrick, prime minister of the federation of which Northern Rhodesia forms a part. He is a bitter opponent of British attempts to draw up a constitution which would be acceptable to the Negro nationalists.

Welensky flew into London Wednesday in an 11th-hour attempt to change the government's proposed reforms which give the Negroes more power in the 15 members of Northern Rhodesia's 45-member Legislative Council who are elected by both white and Negro voters.

At present, white candidates for the 15 mixed-vote seats need about four per cent of the Negro votes in any constituency to qualify for election but Negro candidates need 12 per cent of white votes.

The changes would make it necessary for both white and Negro candidates to get 10 per cent of the votes in each race.

This would make it easier for a Negro candidate to win a mixed-vote seat because he will now need to get less support from white voters.

## Fisheries Show Sought

Government assistance in establishing a fisheries industry, particularly in Kings County, was recommended by the Prince Edward Island Fisheries Board yesterday.

The recommendation was one of many dealing with economics of the fishing industry, contained in a federation brief presented to the Legislature. The brief was read by federation president J.L. Noonan, Charlottetown, who was accompanied by the directors and other members of the federation executive.

It was stated in the brief that establishment of a fisheries exhibition would "round out the summer's activities," since other arrangements a lobster carnival and some week end exhibition in Kings County would be a rounded program and "benefit both fisheries and tourist departments."

## Grisley Toll For Days 65 Dead, 93 Hurt

FRENCH TROOPS — Two time bombs set in a busy street by European extremists blasted 50 Muslims to death Wednesday and brought the day's death toll to 65 in Algeria's grisley reign of terror.

Military officials said 93 persons were wounded.

The bombs, placed in a car and truck on a crowded street in the Muslim quarter went off with devastating blasts, leaving maimed and dying writhing in the street. Many of the victims were women and children.

An estimated 50 persons were injured in the blast. Doctors said they would have to amputate the limbs of many to save their lives.

French troops were rushed to the quarter to prevent Muslims from taking reprisals in the European section of the city. They set up machine-gun posts and fired mortar cars at the main exits from the quarter.

## Nehru Elected, Majority Cuts

NEW DELHI (Reuters) — Minister Nehru was personally re-elected Wednesday night but with a sharply lower majority than in the 1957 Indian general election.

Nehru defeated his nearest rival, Socialist leader Ram Manohar Lohia, by 64,500 votes—a surprising reduction compared with his 193,000-vote majority over Lohia in 1957.

## N.S. LEGISLATURE OPENS

HALIFAX (CP) — The Atlantic Provinces Economic Council has proposed a five-point incentive program designed to develop manufacturing in the industry-hungry Atlantic region.

The APPEC, a regional self-help organization, stresses the need for funds to develop manufacturing, educational facilities to train workers and transportation assistance to move products to the region.

The incentive program is outlined in a pamphlet released by APPEC Wednesday.

It suggests a capital fund, provided by the federal government, to assist in making "basic improvements in the capital structure of the region." These improvements would result from "the application of the principles of a capital projects commission and an industrial estates scheme.

The pamphlet also urges loans and grants toward acquisition of industrial machinery and equipment and "corporation tax incentives, to supplement these other, more direct, types of assistance.

## Hurricane Rips Mauritius Island

LONDON (AP) — A hurricane tore a destructive path across the island of Mauritius in the Indian Ocean Wednesday destroying 1,800 buildings and seriously injuring at least 125 inhabitants, the British Red Cross reported.

The Red Cross said 8,000 were homeless.

## Steps Forecast To Boost Output Of Basic Industry

HALIFAX (CP) — The Nova Scotia government indicated Wednesday it plans to work directly with private industry to increase production from the province's basic industries.

The speech from the throne opening this year's session of the legislature said the government believes some basic industries will progress more rapidly if they adopt "considered expansion targets."

The House will be asked to authorize a cabinet member to work with the industries in planning objectives for increasing the government's development activities.

The speech, read by Lieutenant-Governor E. C. Plove, also indicated the Progress Conservative government will introduce Robert Stanfield plans to introduce a program of job creation with welfare services, labor affairs and education.

The paragraph speaks said the government is negotiating with the Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation for an increase in its manufacturing facilities in Sydney.
