accused time to make restitution. The accused was represented by Alexander B. Campbell.

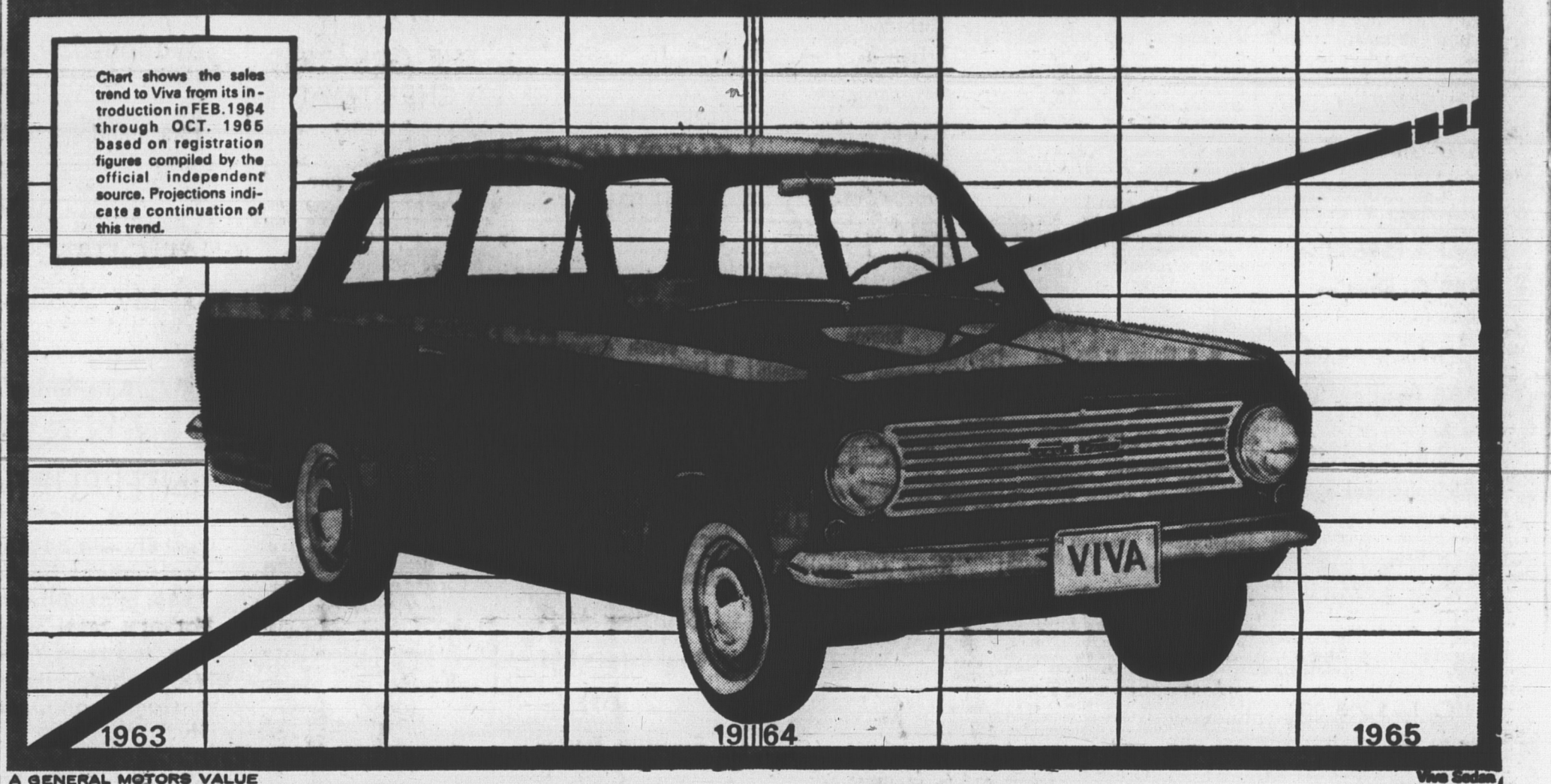
