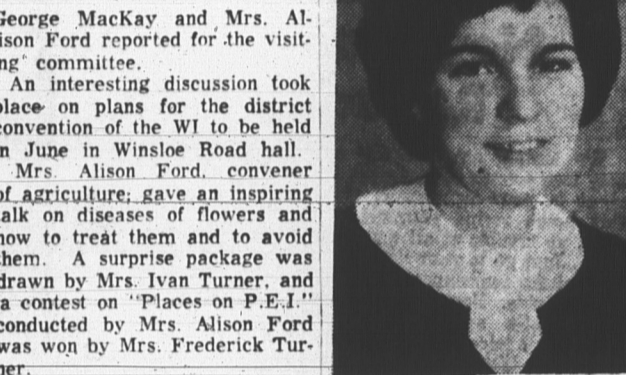
Following the installation of officers by Fr. Corcoran with the Act of Consecration to the Blessed Virgin and blessing, refreshments were served by the executive members.

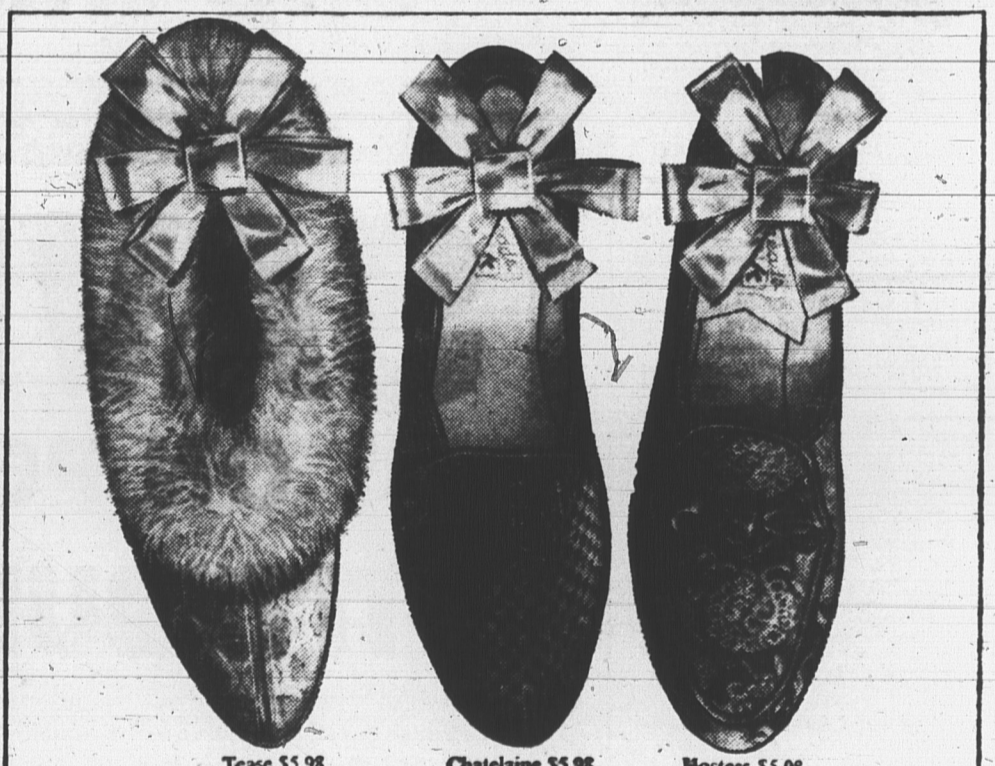
