Magnetizing Cows Means Fewer Deaths

VICTORIA (CP)—Where does a cow carry her pocket watch? If Bossie keeps the timepiece in her four-sectioned belly, it could be fatal.

Cows are sloppy eaters and have been known to gobble up pocket knives, watches and even old car springs.

These assorted pieces of metal which cannot be digested or eliminated result in a malady known as "hardware disease" for many Canadian cows each year.

But fewer and fewer Vancouver Island dairy herds are victims, because farmers have become attracted to the idea of magnetizing their herds.

A small magnet is fastened in the bovine's stomach to prevent the sharp bits of metal from puncturing its walls.

The magnet is made of a metal from moving through the animal," says Dr. David Gaunt, a Victoria veterinary surgeon.

"The magnet is made of a metal alloy not affected by the juices of a cow's stomach.

The cow then carries what he termed a small "hedhog"—jumble of metal used in wartime to stop tanks—but with little discomfort.

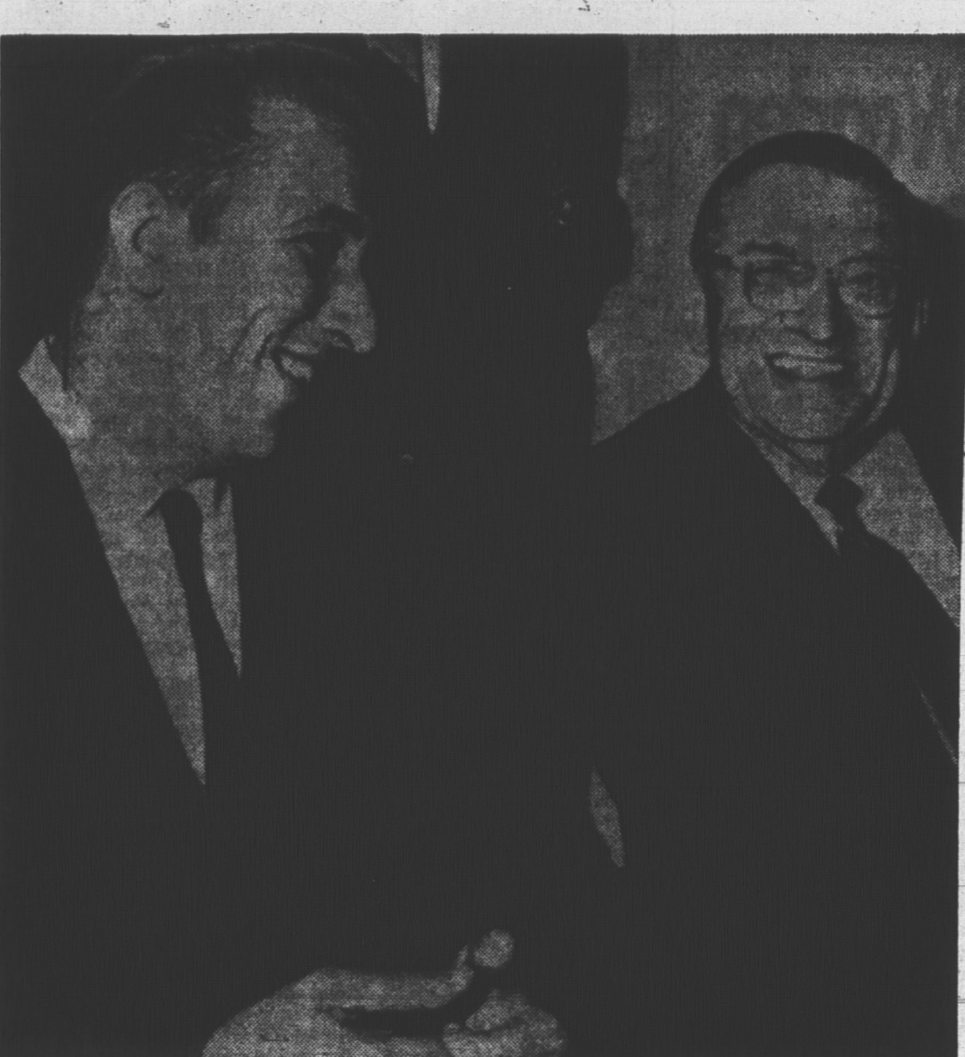

Nobel Prize Winner Plans To Keep Right On With Work

CHICAGO (AP) - Canadian-born Dr. Charles B. Huggins, who earned a Nobel Prize while working a seven-day week, plans to keep right on working against cancer.

He is 65 and his hair is white. But his crewcut and tanned, freckled skin give him a boyish appearance.

"The cancer problem is not yet solved," he told reporters Thursday, "and I shall continue working with cancer so long as Almighty God permits me to."

Dr. Huggins, of the University of Chicago, won the award jointly with Dr. Peyton Rous, 57, of Rockefeller University, New York—whom Huggins calls "my hero in medicine."

CITED FOR DISCOVERIES Huggins, a native of Halifax, was cited for his discoveries concerning hormonal treatment of prostatic cancer based on study of the restraining effect of hormones on cancer. He used three principles to explain: "1. Certain cancer cells differ utterly from the cells from
