

Johnny Sain Signs Contract

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. (AP)—Johnny Sain signed his New York Yankee baseball contract Saturday and took his first workout after ending his brief retirement.

The veteran righthanded pitcher said he had arranged with a lifelong friend to take over his newly

acquired automobile agency at Walnut Ridge, Ark., and said his main interest until October was to help the Yankees win their sixth straight pennant and world series.

Sain was reportedly to have received an \$8,000 increase to boost his salary to \$30,000.

Canadiens And Rangers Win Saturday NHL Games

MONTREAL. (CP)—Montreal Canadiens wound up their home schedule in the closing National Hockey League race Saturday night with an easy 6-1 victory over the weakened Detroit Red Wings, and the Montreal-Toronto scramble for second place hinged on Sunday's window game.

Canadiens' win coupled with Toronto's loss to New York Rangers, moved Montreal back into second place by a one-point margin over the Leafs.

The Red Wings, minus their three top defencemen Saturday night, were easy pickings and trailed 3-0 before Marty Pavelich scored their only goal.

Floyd Curry counted twice for Montreal and Lorne Davis, Bernie (Boom Boom) Geoffrion, Tom Johnson and Ken Mosdell once each.

Defencemen Red Kelly, Bob Goldham, and Marcel Pronovost were Detroit's absentees because of injuries. Gordie Howe, the big right-winger and the league's top points-scorer, took over a defence position in the first period, but left the game after that because of a mild attack of the 'flu.

Except for Howe, Detroit's only defence replacement was Keith

Rangers whittled that right down but Lumley got plenty of help from Montreal Canadiens, who defeated the league-leading Red Wings 6-1 in Montreal and sent Sawchuk's goals-against average to 2.00.

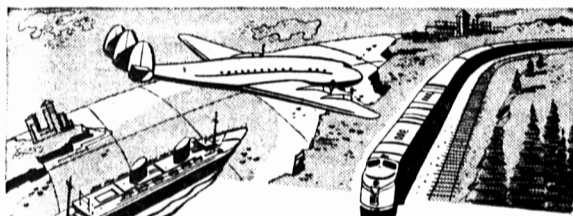

Pilot Training Keyed to Plane Developments.

Trenton, Ont.—Finishing touches are being put to the RCAF's pilot training programme, which over the last several years has been undergoing a gradual change. This has been necessitated by today's operational air force requirements, and by the general need of the expanding RCAF for more pilots.

The changes, in addition to opening of numerous new flying training schools, have involved introduction of new training aircraft and a reorganization of the pattern of the schools themselves.

Today's aircrew training programme sees the embryo flyer reporting first to the Officers' School at London, Ontario, where he is selected for training as a radio officer, navigator or pilot. Following preliminary ground training at London he then goes to a Flying Training School where he learns to fly on Harvard's.

Then comes an Advanced Flying School, where he flies T-33 Silver Star jets or twin-engine Mitchells, depending on the type of squadron for which he is destined. Next—for those eventually going to a fighter squadron—comes Air Weapons School. The final stage for all pilots, before reaching an actual squadron, is an Operational Training Unit, where the pilot for the first time flies the type of aircraft flown by the squadron for which he is destined.

After OTU comes a squadron posting, and the beginning of the pilot's operational career. Training never ends, though, for most of the pilot's peacetime work is centered about retraining himself for combat duties.

Pilot training in the RCAF is a demanding task, calling for the best. The man who wears the pilot wings of the RCAF, though, or those of the radio-officer or navigator, is stamped as one who is ready to defend our way of life. Today's aircrew trainees learn more than their aircrew duties. Among other things they learn much about those from other lands, for they mingle with similar student aircrew from nine other NATO nations, all taking their flying training in Canada.
