Canadian Officer Recalls MacArthur Rallied Pacific

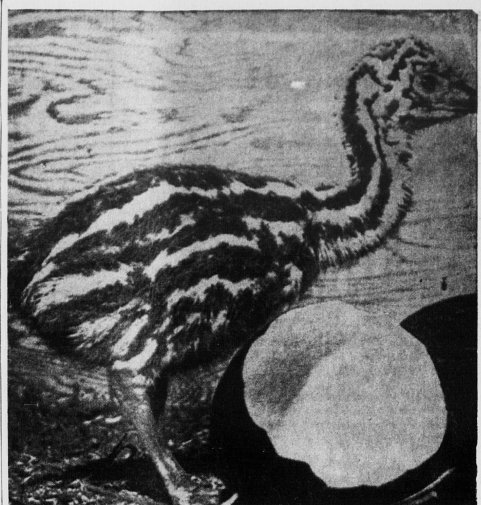
WINNIPEG (CP) — The officer who headed the Canadian mission to Gen. MacArthur's Pacific headquarters remembers him as an outstanding personality who rallied the whole Pacific area after early American defeats.

Brig. R. S. Malone, now publisher of the Winnipeg Free Press, said he agrees with Field Marshal Lord Alanbrooke's assessment of MacArthur as "possibly the outstanding strategist of the war."

On Saturday, the Maritime Women's Institute entertained at an afternoon tea meeting in honor of Mrs. E. G. Gilchrist, Ottawa, director of women's activities for the Canadian Highways Safety Council and Mrs. Evelyn Cadmore, Charlottetown, provincial director. It is being sponsored by Trinity Men's Association. Mr. Henry B. Yeo has donated the theatre free of charge to the Men's Association for this film.

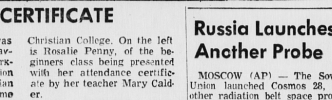

MOSCOW (AP) — The Soviet Union launched Cosmos 28, another radiation belt space probe, Saturday and disclosed it has switched the course of Zond I to Venus.

Jet Plunges Into Homes

TOKYO (AP) — A U.S. Marine Corps jet interceptor plunged into a residential area 20 miles southwest of Tokyo Sunday, killing four Japanese and injuring 26 others while flattening 10 homes.

The pilot of the plane, Capt. R. L. Bown of Seattle, ejected at 5,000 feet and parachuted while the F-8U Crusader jet was nosing straight down, a U.S. navy spokesman said. Bown was bruised on landing on an automobile and was reported in good condition.
