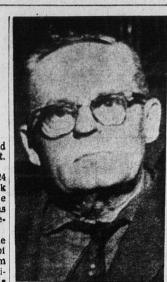

MOSCOW (AP) - Cuban Premier Castro arrived in the Soviet Union today, the Tass agency reported. It said he came on a friendly visit at the invitation of the chairman of the U.S.S.R. council of ministers, Nikita Khrushchev.

A communique... Khrushchev issued his invitation in a personal letter to the Cuban leader. The Soviet premier expressed a desire that Castro get to know the Soviet Union and "see the great successes obtained by the Soviet people."

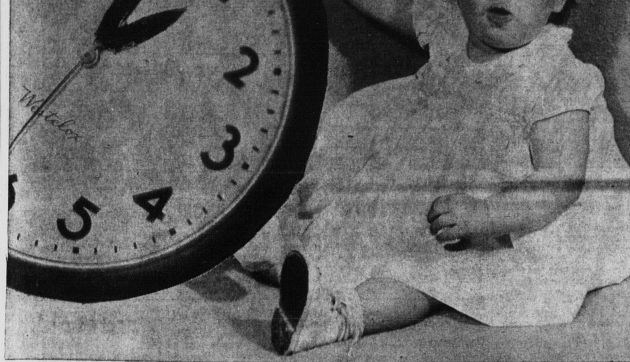
