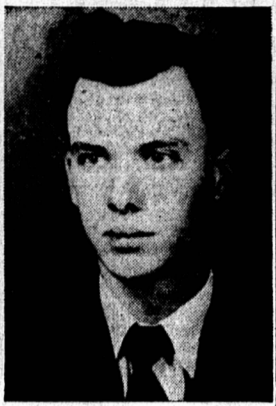
Shelton Roy Adams

Lead Poisoning Kills Eight Cattle In Ont.

GUELPH, Ont., May 23 (CP)—Lead poisoning today was said to have caused the death of at least eight cattle on the farm of Gordon Gregson, 20 miles north of here.

Dr. J. A. Henderson of the Ontario Veterinary College said that traces of lead were found in the intestinal tract of one of the animals brought here for examination.

The animals began dying on the Gregson farm a week ago last Tuesday. In all nine died and 15 others were believed affected.
