**WE'RE ON THE LAND**  
While it may not be correct to state that cropping operations are general, nevertheless, much of the better drained land is fit to work and even a week ago early potatoes had been planted. The heat and showers of the past few days has stimulated rapid growth in pastures and by next week there will probably be some limited grazing. For the next six weeks field work will be the order of the day and tractors will be heard both night and day as farmers extend themselves to the utmost to complete seeding operations at an early date as possible.

**CALFHOOD VACCINATION**  
While for some years cattlemen of this province have had available a service for the vaccination of calves against contagious abortion, nevertheless, very few have taken advantage of it. While contagious abortion has been a problem in this province that fact does not do away with the absolute necessity of farmers vaccinating their calves if they expect to share in markets for dairy cattle outside the province and also to protect themselves against an outbreak of the disease which can be a very costly and bitter experience.

Mr. L. W. Roper who recently took a position with the Ayrshire Breeders in Ontario reports that in the herds he has visited it is a rare exception to find one being calfhood vaccinated is not being vaccinated. Mr. Roper points out that it is extremely difficult, almost impossible, to make sales of unvaccinated animals and that if the disease ever got a foothold on Prince Edward Island it would probably spread like a forest fire. For the cattle breeders calfhood vaccination is a must and the far seeing farmers will not delay bringing his herd under the vaccination program.

(ario with the coming of the three-quart jug. Normally milk is sold in Ontario for 22 cents a quart but the three quart jug is being offered at from 55 to 58 cents cash and carry. This large bottle has had a mixed reception on the part of the producers in many of whom see the possibility of pressure to lower their price if competition between quarts and jugs becomes keen. On the other hand there is the possibility that milk consumption might increase in total if the consumer acquires the habit of buying in larger quantities.

**MILK PRODUCTION**  
During the December, January, February period just past milk production in Canada declined over 34 million pounds as compared with the same period of a year ago. From information available it would appear that the number of milk cows in Canada is showing a slight decline. All this indicates that the production and consumption begin to appear more closely in balance for the future.

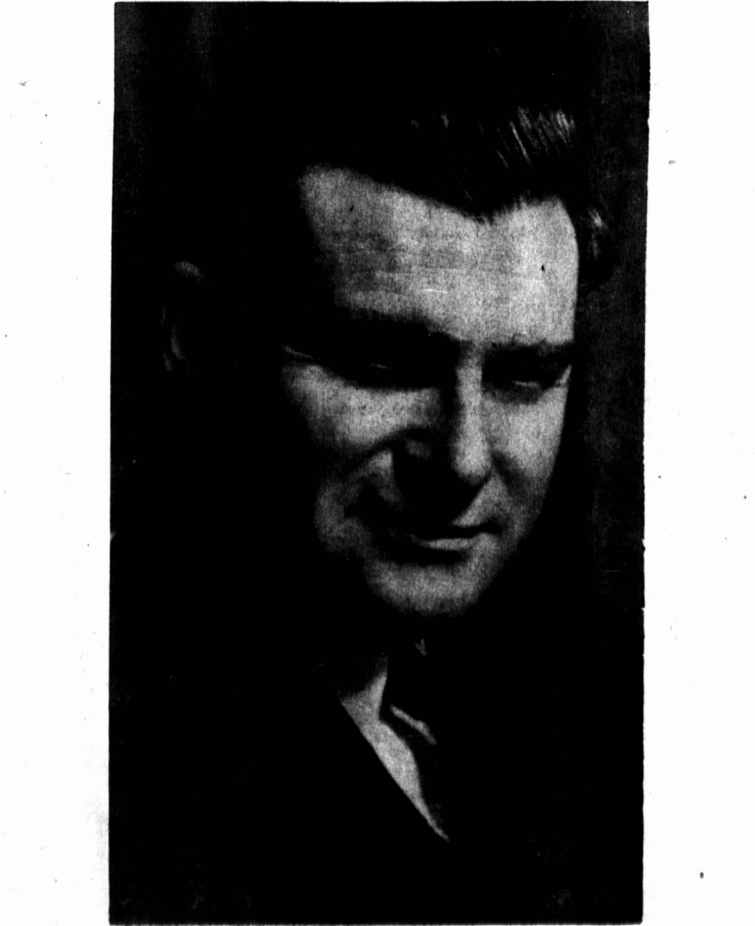
