

# Hot Ottawa Rough Riders Advance To Eastern Finals

OTTAWA (CP) — Ottawa Rough Riders exploded for three touchdowns in the second quarter and rolled on Saturday to trounce Montreal Alouettes 36-7 in the sudden-death Eastern Football Conference semifinal.

Riders now meet Hamilton Tiger-Cats in the two-game total-point league final for the right to represent the East in the Grey Cup final at Toronto late this month.

Halfback Bo Scott paced the Riders' attack with two touchdowns while quarterback Russ Jackson and halfbacks Ronnie

Stewart and Gene Gaines added one each. Tackle Moe Racine converted all five and added a single when a 31-yard field goal attempt was wide.

Flanker Terry Evanshen got the Montreal touchdown in the dying minutes of the game. Charlie Baillie kicked the convert.

Riders broke the game wide open in the second quarter when they turned three pass interceptions into touchdowns. Linebacker Ken Lehman started things with an interception at the Montreal 45. Six plays later Stewart took a 16-

yard pass from Jackson for the first scoring play of the game. JACKSON SCORES ON RUN

Two plays after the kickoff linebacker Bill Quinter intercepted a Bernie Faloney pass on the Ottawa 50 and ran for 28 yards. Again it took the Riders six plays to score. Jackson sweeping around left end from the three for the touchdown.

Montreal managed only five plays after that score before Gaines picked off a pass on his own 45 and ran 65 yards for the score.

Ottawa's fourth score also came on a Montreal miscue when a third-down snap was high and punter Jim McKean was downed on his own 12. Scott ran for the touchdown on the Riders' first play.

Scott's second touchdown came in the fourth quarter when he broke off tackle for a 45-yard scoring play.

# Knight Norris Captures Two

SUMMERSIDE — Knight Norris was the only double-dash winner on the card at Summerside raceway here Saturday. Before a small crowd on a chilly afternoon, the brown gelding owned, trained and driven by Junior Chappell of Kinkora won the first dash in 2:12.2 and repeated in the fifth in the time of 2:13.2. The quinella on the first race paid \$38.40 on a combination of Knight Norris and Tennessee Riley, the biggest pay of the afternoon.

Riders' ground out 266 yards rushing with Scott and fullback Jim Dillard doing most of the work. Dillard ran 15 times for 92 yards while Scott carried eight times for 83. Stewart added 38 yards on eight carries.

Fullback J. W. Lockett ran for 68 of Montreal's 115-yard rushing total in his 15 carries while halfback Pat Batters added 49 on eight trips.

Faloney held the edge in passing yardage, completing 13 of 24 for 161 yards. Jackson was good on nine of 18 for 125 yards and his relief man, Bill Cline, hit on two of four for 34.

Only eight penalties were called during the game. Riders lost 61 yards on three calls—two of them pass interference—while the Alouettes lost 50 on five calls—two for roughing.

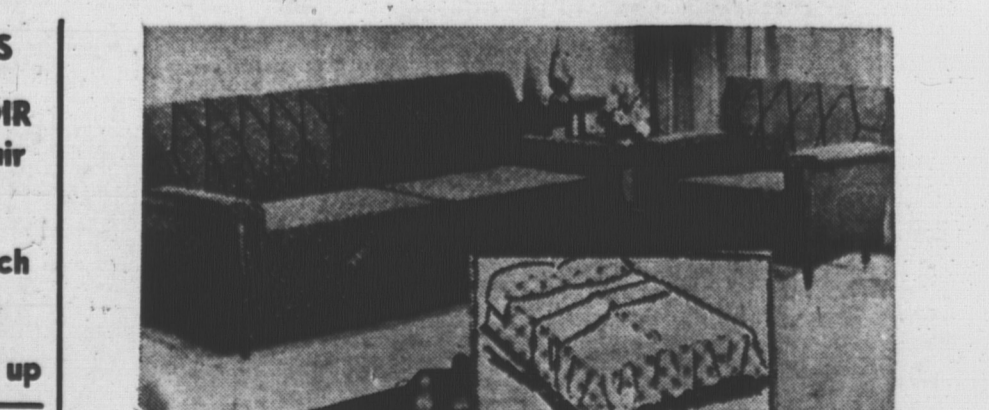
