We almost saw Him meet her on the shore. And lead her through the golden gates, where never. Sorrow or death can ever enter there.

Many relatives and friends were filled with deep regret when it became known that on Saturday, March 17 at 1:40 o'clock, the grim reaper had visited the home of Mr. Rowan Sencabaugh, Oak Valley, P.E.I., claiming for its own his beloved mother in her 85th year.

Mrs. Sencabaugh was born in Murray Harbour, North. The daughter of the late John B. and (Phoebe) Hicken Graham. Over sixty-five years ago she was united in marriage with John H. Sencabaugh also of Murray Harbour North. To this union was born two sons and two daughters. Mrs. Sencabaugh was what might be called a pioneer woman. After living in Murray Harbour North for a short while she and her husband took up residence in what was then called Pembroke (now Oak Valley) here by hard work and integrity, they carved for themselves a home out of the thin untilled soil until today there stands a comfortable homestead, a lasting tribute to many years of sacrifice and toil.

Although not enjoying the best of health for a number of years, she always had the stimulus to make a joke and have a cheerful smile for her loved ones and any who visited her. Her home was her castle, and many pleasant evenings were spent therein by friends and neighbors, as she was very fond of music and enjoyed singing The Old Hymns with her friends. At an early age she affiliated herself with the Presbyterian Church in the community and was a regular worshipper unless prevented by illness.

A few weeks previous to her passing she suffered a stroke but by her courage and will power she was able after a while to sit up in her chair. The last week however, she was confined to her bed and gradually growing weaker until on the above date she ended her earthly sojourn and entered into her eternal home to be with her father whom she served and loved during her long life. During her illness she was lovingly cared for by her son and his devoted wife, who did everything possible to alleviate her suffering and make her comfortable. She will be greatly missed not only in her home but also by her many friends for her cheery smile and friendly greeting.

The funeral which was to have been held at 11 A.M. on Wednesday was postponed owing to road conditions and was held Wednesday with a short service at the house followed by service at eleven o'clock in the Murray Harbour North Presbyterian Church, where despite the poor travelling a large concourse of people were assembled to pay their last respects to an old and esteemed resident of the community. The service was conducted by the Minister, Rev. M. Carl Currie, who brought a comforting message to the bereaved. He was assisted by Rev. Mr. Patterson of the United Church Georgetown, a friend of the family. The following hymns were sung—"The Lord's My Shepherd," "What a friend we have in Jesus," and "It pays to Serve Jesus," a favorite of the deceased. She was tenderly laid to rest in the cemetery, Murray Harbour North beside her husband who deceased here by four years there to await the final resurrection. The pall bearers all nephews were, Clair, Donny, George, Wilbert, Graham.
