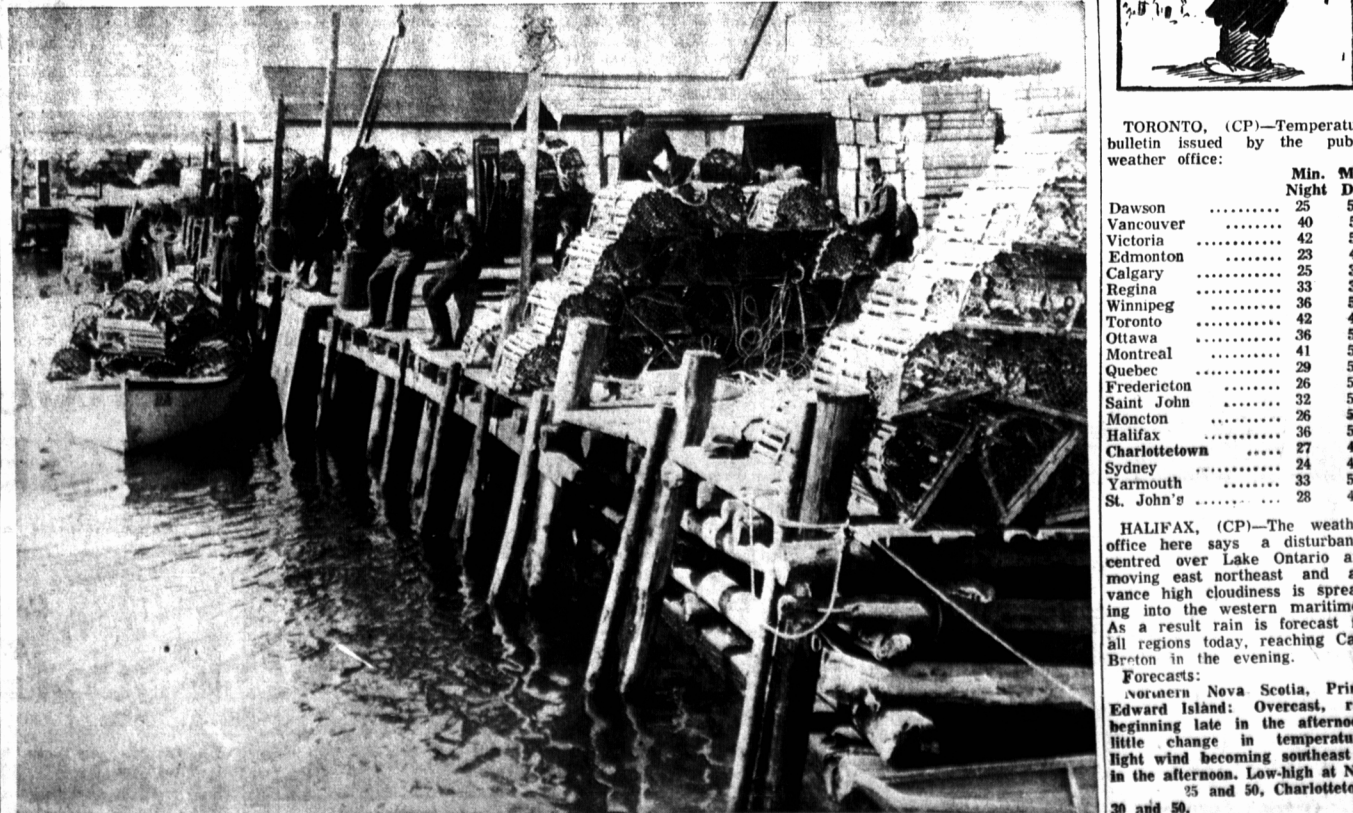
LEGAL ARGUMENT
