## Big Oil Tanker Now In Port

The "Irving Glen" arrived in Charlottetown Harbour early Thursday afternoon to discharge a considerable quantity of Irving gasoline and fuel oil. The largest ship of the Irving fleet, with a tonnage in excess of 18,000 tons, she began pumping her cargo at 4.30 p.m. Thursday, and is expected to clear port about 7.00 a.m. on Saturday.

In service for only a year, the Japanese built ship last called at Charlottetown in December, 1956. Prior to arrival in Charlottetown from Aruba, in the Dutch West Indies, she discharged part of her cargo at Halifax, and will unload the following quantities of Irving products during her brief stay: 1,900,000 gallons of Irving gasoline; 900,000 gallons of Irving fuel oil; and 1,000,000 gallons of Irving fuel oil.
