

Drought Blamed For Cut In Farmers' Net Income

OTTAWA — Canada's total net farm income in 1961 was almost 22 per cent below the revised estimate for 1960, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported Thursday in its regular annual preliminary estimate.

Net income for 1961 was \$1,033,700,000 compared with the revised figure of \$1,319,900,000 for 1960. Last year's figure was the lowest since 1937 when the total was \$1,058,300,000, the bureau said.

Most of the reduction was attributed to the prairie drought, which halved the 1961 wheat

crop, and the consequent drop in the year-end inventories of grain on farms. Increased farm operating costs and depreciation charges also contributed.

Decreases in total farm net income were recorded for each of the Maritime provinces, Manitoba and Saskatchewan. There was little change in Alberta. Increases ranging from just under three per cent to nearly five per cent were estimated for the remaining provinces.

NET INCOME UP

Realized net income of Canadian farmers from 1961 farming operations was estimated at \$2,340,000,000, almost three per cent above the revised estimate of \$2,300,000,000 for 1960 and 4.5 per cent higher than the 1956 60-five-year average of \$2,282,700,000.

Increases in realized farm net income were registered by all provinces except the Maritimes and Ontario. The increases ranged from about one per cent in British Columbia to nearly 13 per cent in Saskatchewan. The declines ranged from seven per cent in Ontario to 44 per cent in Prince Edward Island.

The net in realized farm net income for all of Canada between 1960 and 1961 was attributed almost entirely to reduced high returns from the sale of farm products.

Realized net income is obtained by adding together farm cash income from farming operations, supplementary payments and the value of income in kind, and deducting farm operating expenses and depreciation charges.

Total net income is reached by adjusting realized net income to take into account imputed amounts for the value of livestock and stocks of grain on farms between the start and end of the year.
