## To Succeed Former Islander As Marshal

OTTAWA (CP)—Lt.-Col. J. R. Stone, who led the first Canadian troops in action in Korea, is being promoted full colonel Aug. 1 and appointed provost marshal for the Canadian Army, it was announced Monday.

The 45-year-old Salmon Arm, B.C., veteran now is serving as chief instructor at the Royal Canadian School of Infantry at Camp Borden, Ont. In his new post he will succeed Lt.-Col. J. R. Stewart of Charlottetown, P.E.I., whose further appointment will be announced later.

Col. Stone, a seasoned infantry commander of the Italian and northwest Europe campaigns of the Second World War, commanded the second battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry in Korea.

## Three Gold Mines Unite In Project

TORONTO, (CP)—Three gold mines have teamed up in what is believed the only effort now under way in Canada to bring a gold mine into production.

An official of Eder Mines, a northwestern Quebec producer, said Monday a financial deal has been completed with two other mines that will, if fully exercised, provide about \$1,000,000 for development of Eldrich Mines in Quebec's Duprat township about eight miles northeast of Noranda.

The other two mines in the financing were named as Lamague Gold Mines, also a northwestern Quebec producer, and Goldale Mines, with interests in northern Ontario. It was expected shaft-sinking will be under way at Eldrich by fall.

The last Canadian gold mine to become a producer was Consolidated Discovery in 1949.
