**SHATTERING THE
FREE TRADE IDOL.**

One of the theories frequently put forward by traders is that under a system of free trade the manufacturers are more likely to be wide awake, alert and enterprising, because they are spurred to do their best by world-wide competition. This theory has been rather badly shaken recently by the success of the protected manufacturers of the United States and Germany in competition with British manufacturers. Lord Claude Hamilton, chairman of the Great Eastern Railway Company of England, has written to Sir Charles Edward Howard Vincent, M. P., founder of the Empire Trade League, that his company has given a large order for steel rails to the Carnegie Company, because in the first place of provoking delays in the delivery of steel rails on two contracts already given in England, and also because the company could get better material, more prompt delivery and a lower price in the United States than in England.

The free trade idols worshipped by the British people for about half a century is getting badly shattered. —Montreal Star.

TO INVADE BRITAIN.

In the French Senate the other day General Mercier made a speech pointing out the ease with which Britain could be invaded. General Mercier is reported to have said:

"In view of the possibility of war with Great Britain the ease of the army is not sufficiently taken into account. The times are not the same as they were a hundred years ago. Steam, the navy, the telegraph and the railroad have rendered the problem of the invasion of England much easier of solution. Moreover, England herself is no longer the same. The Transvaal war has shown that the British army, although brave, is not equal to the task which England expected it to perform. The British navy is powerful, but it has many coasts to defend.

"France, therefore, is numerically England's equal at certain points, and is her superior in the instruments of destruction. History furnishes many instances of mutiny in the English navy at the moment of battle. A landing in England is therefore not beyond realization.

"This is not only my opinion, but that also of high naval officers. The British premier recently expressed significant fears; and if the principle of landing is admitted the practical means of execution may be discussed.

"I venture to think that the work I prepared while commanding an army corps could serve as a basis for such a project, which would not be expensive."

At this point protests were raised and Mr Fallieres asked General Mercier not to enter into details of the scheme.

General Mercier replied that the scheme could be "held over the head of England, like the sword of Damocles," and he proposed a resolution that the senate should invite the Government to complete immediate preparations for the mobilization of the army and navy by preparing everything necessary to embark and disembark as rapidly as possible an expeditionary corps.

The late General Moltke, of whom perhaps General Mercier has heard, was once asked his opinion about the invasion of England. His reply was to the effect that he did not think it at all possible to get an army into England, but he never could devise a way of getting it out after it got in. If General Mercier is wise, he will not invade England until he has solved the problem that the great German general's reply suggests. —Halifax Herald.
