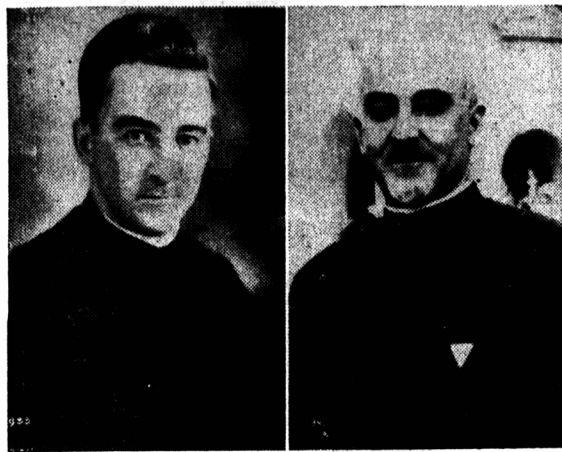


Island Priest Writes Home From Suchow Prison Camp



The following letter was received recently by Rev. Sister St. Theodore, of St. Augustine's Convent, Rustico, from her brother, the Rev. Cornelius Pineau, S. J., a missionary in China since 1935 and presently one of eight Canadian Jesuits who are prisoners of the Communists at Suchow. The above pictures are of Father Pineau, the one on the left taken in 1935 prior to his leaving for China. many of whom I know and remember well, but also many whom I do not know. I count on you to express to them my most sincere thanks. It is not easy for me to write each one, even a short word. You are much better situated than I am and I have no doubt that you will express my gratitude as well as I could do. Please tell them that by way of thanking them I recommend to God at each mass, themselves, their relatives, and all their undertakings. I think them especially for the masses and prayers offered for my safety. I accept them wholeheartedly. It will not be without great need.

"I have nothing of great interest to tell you this time. Solicit many prayers for the native clergy and their Christians. A large number of them are already deprived of the benefits of the Church, and what happens in these circumstances is that there is always the evil one roaming about to see whom he may devour.

"We were to have our permits renewed at the end of December, but up to date we have not yet been molested. It must be due to your prayers. Best regards to all the family and to my numerous friends and benefactors. May all in their prayers widen the scope of their charity at least as big as the whole Celestial Empire."

and the families of heart patients that the sooner the heart patient gets back on the job, the better he'll feel and the better he'll work. And when the heart patient is anxious about his ability to work and his safety, heart associations are encouraging the use of "sheltered workshops" to help heart patients increase their confidence and work capacity, so that they can later take jobs in industry the same as those without heart disease.
