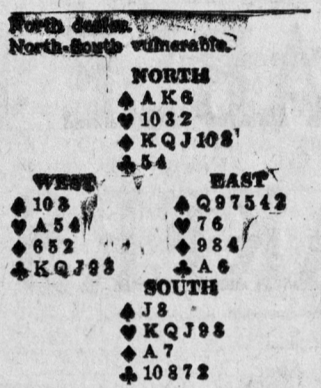

The bidding: North East South West 1♣ Pass 1♥ 2♣ Pass 2♥ Pass 4♥ Pass

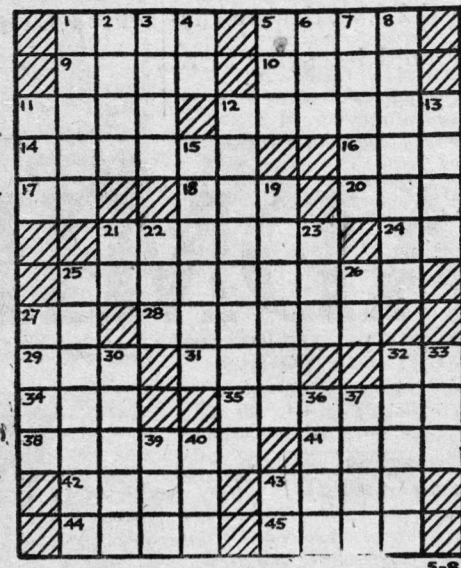
One test of a good dummy player is his ability to avoid defeat when it appears to be imminent. Ingenuity in fending off apparent defeat of a contract consists mainly of visualizing holdings the defenders may have which will permit fulfillment of the contract.

and East's line of defense that East is out of clubs. So the queen of clubs is trumped with dummy's ten, East discarding a diamond.

No other possibility of making the contract presents itself that is as attractive as this one. Accordingly, declarer proceeds on the basis that it is actually the case. The ace and another diamond are played, followed by a high diamond from dummy. If East does not ruff, declarer will discard and make the contract. So East ruffs.
