HALIFAX (CP) — The weather office says a large area of high pressure centred between Cape Cod and Yarmouth will remain nearly stationary today, giving a repeat of the Labor Day weather over all parts of the district. Afternoon temperatures should rise to the low 70s in most localities, readings just a little higher than the normals for this time of year.

At this time indications are that Wednesday will also be mainly sunny and warm.
