...*Friends and relatives are happy to know that Mrs. William Baker has recovered from her illness and is back teaching school again.

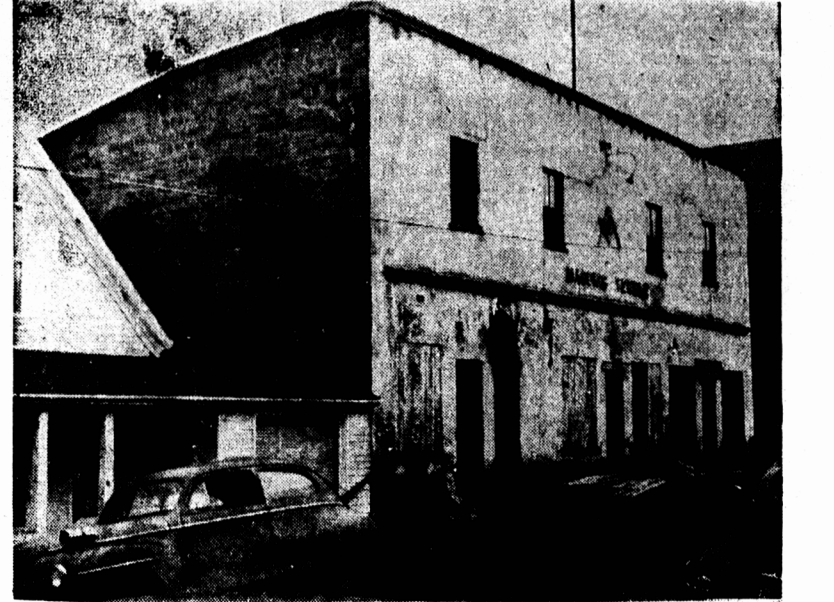
