Yeo, and following his address which was directed mainly to the young people, the distinguished guest signed the town guest book and was introduced to civic officials and visiting dignitaries from Georgetown and Montague. His Excellency then officially opened the Garden of the Gulf Museum, of which he was made an honorary life member, and was presented with a piece of museum china.

The vice regal party then left by motor for the capital through a crowd of cheering citizens, young and old.

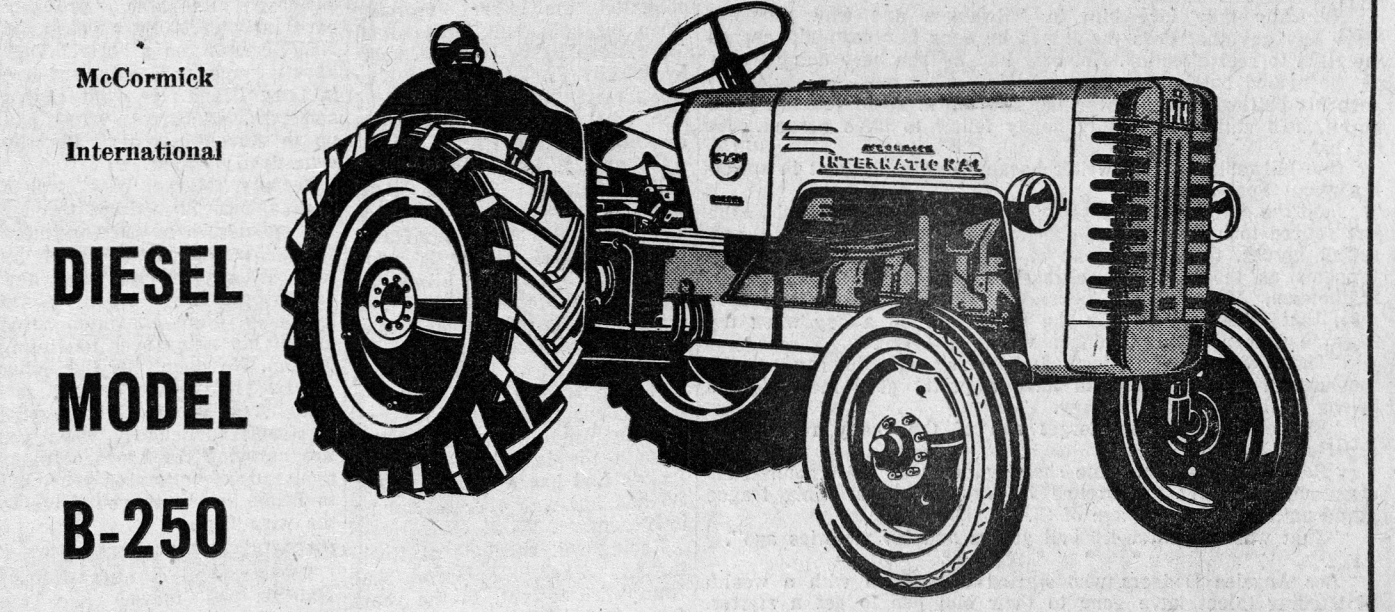
