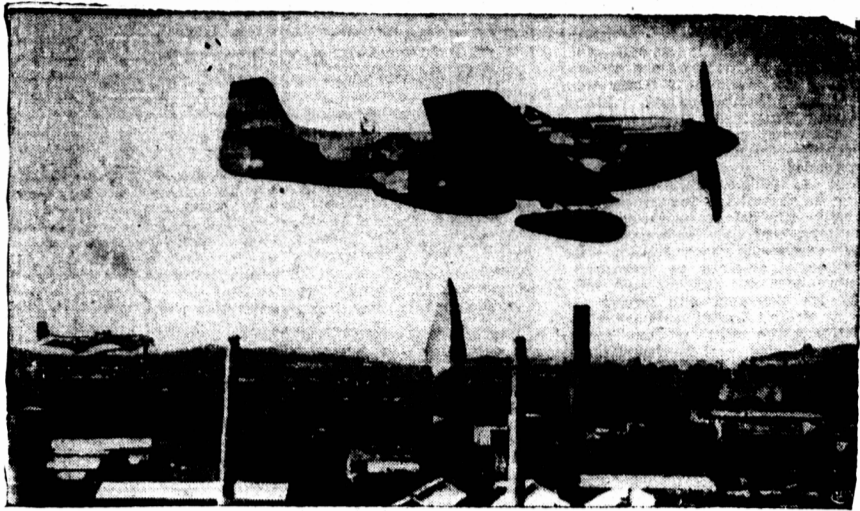


Flaming Napalm On The Way
