Vote \$6,000 To Aid In Completing Montague School

\$6,000.00 was voted by a special meeting last evening of the rate-payers of the Montague school district as additional funds to assist in completing the new school. \$40,000.00 was already voted at the annual school meeting held last June, and with this a new six-room unit has been constructed, which will also contain a large auditorium and laboratory facilities. Mr. S. S. Hessian, Q.C., presided over the meeting, and explained the necessity for the additional funds, stating that part would be used to purchase the land from the Community Welfare League, a total of \$1,000.00, and the remainder, if required, would be used to complete work in the basement and other sections of the building. He stressed the fact that all this extra amount might not be required, but felt that should the need arise, it would be well to have it on hand. He emphasized the fact that the community was getting a \$60,000.00 school built for \$40,000.00 made possible through the co-operation and generosity of all those who were in any way connected with the erection of the building. He stated that parents of the community would be proud to send their children to this modern school, where they would have every facility at their disposal, and he congratulated them for their public spirit which incited them to provide these facilities for their children.
