## Lack Of Counsel Draws Criticism

"I believe the attorney-general's department has fallen down very badly," John P. Nicholson, Charlottetown attorney, said yesterday in city police court.

Mr. Nicholson was referring to the failure of the crown to provide counsel for an informant in a charge of non-support laid against James Robert Doucette, Souris.

Mr. Nicholson said he had been asked to represent the informant, Florence Doucette but he did so because he lacked sufficient time. He said it was the responsibility of the attorney-general's department to provide the informant with "the best counsel obtainable" in a case which concerned "the very structure of the community."

Magistrate A.J. Haslam stated that this was the second time Mr. Nicholson had found himself in such a situation. The accused was remanded to Dec. 18.

John Dunn, Charlottetown, and Richard Hennessey, Charlottetown, charged with being drunk and disorderly on the complaint of William Griffin, Charlottetown restaurant owner, were each fined \$5 and costs or 10 days. Magistrate Haslam warned the pair that if they were convicted of a similar charge in future, they would be barred from entering restaurants.

## 107 Diplomas Are Awarded In Community Development

Those growers dealing with the New Annapolis and Charlottetown plants are expected to attend, as well as prospective growers for the new frozen food plant in Montague.

George MacDonald, president of the federation, will chair the meeting and matters relating to the producing and marketing of crops will come under consideration. The meeting grows out of a directive given at a marketing board meeting held last March at Montgomery Hall, which recommended that the P.E.I. Federation of Agriculture call a meeting of farmers who either grow crops for frozen food plants or are interested in so doing to discuss various situations.

Prior to the graduation ceremonies, the provincial resources development council met to receive a brief presented by Lincoln Dewar, secretary of the P.E.I. Federation of Agriculture. The brief asked that a \$200,000 agricultural research project be carried out in the province.
