English Guns for Uncle Sam.

LONDON, July 27.—At the launching of the British battleship Vengeance at Barrow-in-Furrows, Lieut. Dawson announced that Vickers, Sons, and Maxim, Limited had received an order from the United States for a number of six-inch guns, which were to be adopted for use by the American navy.

Largest Ship in French Navy.

BREST, July 26.—The battleship Suffren was launched here yesterday. She is the largest ship in the French navy, being of 12,500 tons displacement.

JEFFRIES' TOUR

The Champion Fighter to Visit  
England and France.

NEW YORK, July 28.—James Jeffries, the champion heavyweight pugilist of the world, sailed for Southampton in the First Bismark to-day, accompanied by his brother John and Ross O'Neil.

Jeffries, so far, has two matches on in England.

From London he will go to Paris, where he is to box Jem Smith, the former champion of England. Jeffries will also give exhibitions in the theatres in London and Paris.

War's Products.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 27.—The U. S. transport Morgan City, which has been converted into a hospital ship, has arrived from Manila, having on board 473 sick and convalescent soldiers. The vessel started with 476, but three died on the voyage. Every command and almost every regiment is represented among the returning soldiers.

Wireless Telephone.

LONDON, July 27.—Dr. Peter Steins, a Russian, is in England introducing a system of wireless telephone, which he says he has invented. He says that it is as successful as the wire system, and that voices can be recognized at long distances. He proposes to experiment with his system between England and Belgium, and declares that it is feasible to use it between England and the United States.

Wages on the Grand Trunk.

TORONTO, Ont., July 27.—Notice has been given by Superintendent Jones, of the middle division of the Grand Trunk Railway, that an immediate increase will be made in the wages of the trackman on the main line and heavy freight branches of the division. There are about 800 trackmen in the middle division and it is understood that the increase will be given to about two-thirds of the men.

Nicaragua and Honduras.

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, July 27.—President Zelaya, of Nicaragua, has gone to meet General Terencio Sierra, President of the Republic of Honduras, in the Gulf of Conchagua, on the coast of Salvador, with the object of making an offensive and defensive treaty between Nicaragua and Honduras.

French Crop Reports.

PARIS, July 27.—Official reports show that the condition of winter wheat is very good in nine departments of France, good in 67, fair in 8, and bad in one department. Spring wheat is very good in four departments, good in 30, and fair in 13.

Wheeler Goes to Manila.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 26.—The transport Tartar sailed yesterday for Manila with General Joe Wheeler, a portion of the 19th Infantry, and a number of recruits for the army in the Philippines on board.

## HAIL STORM

AT TIGNISH

Hail Stones as Large as  
Robins Eggs.

WINDOWS BROKEN, TREES AND  
BARNs BLOWN DOWN.

Crops in That Vicinity Almost  
Totally Destroyed.

TIGNISH, July 23.—A terrible hail storm lasting ten minutes occurred in and around Tignish yesterday. The hail stones were as large as robins eggs. Half of the windows in houses and stores in the village were broken. Trees and barns were blown down, and the crops where the storm struck were almost totally destroyed. Happily the extent of territory affected was small.

Riots in Austria.

LONDON, July 27.—The Vienna correspondent of the Daily Telegraph reports the existence of a serious state of affairs resulting from riotous agitations against the new taxes, and says that conflicts occurred between the police and the people in Vienna, Graz, and other towns.

Russia and Japan Arming.

PARIS, July 27.—The Politique Coloniale states that Russia and Japan are arming with a view to a possible conflict in Corea.
