They Had The Will And Found The Way!



Twenty-six-year-old Bob Schultz, right, of Churchbridge, Sask., pilot of an RCAF bomber for three years during the war and didn't get a scratch. After the war he enrolled in engineering at the University of Toronto and was well on his way to a promising career when tragedy struck on November, 1950. He was injured in an auto crash and as a result may never walk again. As a quadriplegic, he has no control over his arms and legs. For months he lay despondent in Toronto's Sunnybrook hospital. Then gradually he began to get a hold on himself and finally enrolled in a Canadian legion correspondence course in bookkeeping to keep himself busy. Not content with this he has since embarked on a new venture, a magazine agency to help ease his financial burden and he's got a partner—Stan Davies, left, a 27-year-old ex-navy lad from Hamilton, Ont., he met 18 months ago in hospital where he was being treated as a quadriplegic. "We're working hard on this scheme," says Bob, "and we hope we can make a go of it. Someone's already donated a city directory and we've started mailing out letters and pamphlets."

WINNIPEG, Dec. 2 - (CP) - Prices showed some hesitation as they moved lower in inactive trade today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. The trend was prompted by declines on U.S. markets. Commercial demand was not particularly aggressive here, with offerings slightly more liberal. Early attracted some light export demand, indicating overseas business had been worked. It was not evident whether it was old or new business. American shippers picked up oats. A few export orders appeared in flax. Rye trade was local. There was no information in export loadings of Canadian wheat. Prices for the top-grades of class two wheat northwards were down 1 1/2 cents from yesterday. MINIMUM PRICES CONSIGNMENT SALES

PURSUANT to the provision of the Prince Edward Island Potato Marketing Scheme as authorized by the provisions of the Agricultural Products Marketing (Prince Edward Island) Act, the Prince Edward Island Potato Marketing Board hereinafter called the "Potato Board" hereby orders and determines as follows:

1. Board Order Number 10 passed on the 15th day of September, 1952 is hereby amended by striking out Sections (3) and (4) of said Order and substituting in lieu thereof as Sections (3) and (4) the following:

(3) From and after midnight of December 2, 1952 and until further ordered, the minimum prices at which the following varieties and grades of potatoes may be bought from producers shall be as follows:

(a) Irish Cobbler Certified Seed Potatoes, All Grades, \$3.25 per hundred pounds; (b) Green Mountains, Sebago and Katahdin Certified Seed Potatoes, All Grades, \$2.85 per hundred pounds.

(4) All of the above prices shall be the minimum prices quoted and paid to producers in respect of bulk graded stock at the Producers' farm."

QUEBEC, Dec. 2 - (CP) - Premier Duplessis said Thursday inter-provincial transportation of margarine from one province to another through Quebec will not be affected by government legislation tightening Quebec's anti-margarine ban. "The purpose of the bill," he told a reporter, "is not to prevent inter-provincial trade but to prevent transportation of margarine from one point to another in the province or from an outside province into Quebec province."
