

Canadiens Down Rangers; Toronto Tramples Chicago

 Montreal Canadiens banged in four goals in the third period Saturday night to defeat New York Rangers 6-3 and move closer to first place—up for contention Sunday between Detroit and Boston.

At Toronto, the Maple Leafs made it three in a row by trouncing the Chicago Black Hawks 6-3. The victory boosted the Leafs into a fourth-place tie with New York.

At Montreal Saturday, Jean Beaulieu scored his 18th and 19th goals of the season and contributed one assist. The three points boosted his total to 52 as the National Hockey League's leading point getter.

Bernie (Room Boom) Geoffrion signalled his return to action after a long layoff because of injuries by scoring one goal and counting two assists. Other Montreal scorers were Maurice Rockett Richard with his 12th of the season, Claude Provost and Don Marshall.

HARS COME ALIVE
 Danny Lewicki, Andy Heberton and Dean Prentice scored for the Canadiens. A crowd of 15,794 saw a comparatively mediocre display for two periods. The teams were tied 2-2 going into the third period when Canadiens suddenly got rolling in high gear, throwing 25 shots at goalie Lorne Worsley. Rangers began to fade.

The loss Saturday was Hawks' third in 34 starts and left them in last place, 11 points behind Toronto.

Toronto took an early 2-0 lead but Hawks battled back to tie the score before the end of the first period. Then Leafs went ahead 3-2 in the second period and were never behind after that.

Centres Tod Sloan, Rudy Migay and Mike Nykoluk, left wingers Bob Pulford and Sid Smith and defenceman Al MacNeil scored the Toronto goals. Left wingers Hec Lalande and Harry Watson and centre Glen Skov were the Chicago scorers.

Leafs held a wide edge in territorial play, especially in the first period when they outshot Chicago 16-8, but Hawk goal-tender Al Rollins kept his team in the game during the first two periods with some sensational puck-stopping.

Chicago Shuts Out Leafs 2-0

CHICAGO (CP) — Al Rollins' goal-tending provided Chicago Black Hawks with a 2-0 National Hockey League victory over Toronto Maple Leafs here Sunday night.

The string-bean Chicago goalie's second whitewash of the season was his finest effort. Toronto, battling to stay ahead of the Hawks in fifth place, poured 38 shots at him during the rough night.

Gus Morrison scored Chicago's first marker early in the second period when his long slap-shot from the blue line eluded Toronto goalie Ed Chadwick.

Leafs coach Howie Meeker yanked Chadwick during the final minute of play and Toronto held the puck in Chicago ice most of the time. However, with two seconds to go Chicago's Glen Skov fired in the open net for the final tally.

Adding to the pain of the Leafs' loss, was the possible serious injury to their star centre, Tod Sloan. He left the game with a shoulder injury and was sent for x-rays.

It was feared he was suffering from a broken shoulder.

Bruins Win To Take Top Place

DETROIT (AP) — Fleming Mackell scored three goals as Boston Bruins regained first place in the National Hockey League by defeating Detroit Red Wings 4-2 Sunday night. The victory was the first for the Bruins in Detroit in 23 straight starts. It was also Detroit's first defeat on home ice in 18 games this season.

Mackell scored twice in the second period and once in the third. Red Kelly got Detroit off to a 1-0 lead when he scored at 7:24 of the first period on passes from Alex Delvecchio and Bill Dea. Real Delvecchio tied it up for the Bruins when he scored at 12:01, John Peirson and Allan Stanley getting assists on the play.

Doug Mohns and Jerry Toppazzini aided Mackell as he blasted his first scoring shot past Detroit goalie Joe Hall at 3:56 of the second period. Toppazzini made the key pass less than seven minutes later when Mackell pushed another shot past Hall. Veteran Ted Lindsay brought Detroit to within

Police said they found Baird attempting to choke his wife, who had been beaten and stabbed earlier.

The jockey was booked on charges of aggravated assault and attempted murder. However, Mrs. Baird said she would not press the charges and the district attorney's office said the case would be dropped.
