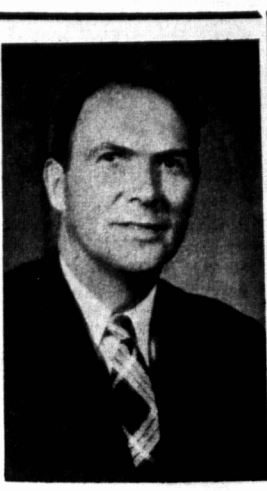

Had Majority Of Over 12,000

Among the largest majorities won by candidates in the recent Dominion election was that of Walter G. Dinsdale, Progressive Conservative candidate in the Brandon-Souris riding of Manitoba. Forty-five minutes after the poll closed Mr. Dinsdale received a congratulatory message from his Liberal opponent who had conceded Dinsdale's election before a fifth of the polls in the constituency had reported. When the final vote was tabulated Mr. Dinsdale had a majority of over 12,000 and all three of his opponents lost their deposits.

Mr. Dinsdale visited Prince Edward Island in April on the invitation of a close friend Heath Macquarrie and spoke at meetings in Charlottetown, Victoria and Belfast. He was elected to the house of Commons in 1951 capturing the Brandon seat which had been held for 14 years by J.E. Matthews a native of Prince Edward Island. In the last parliament Mr. Dinsdale was a desk mate of J. Angus MacLean.

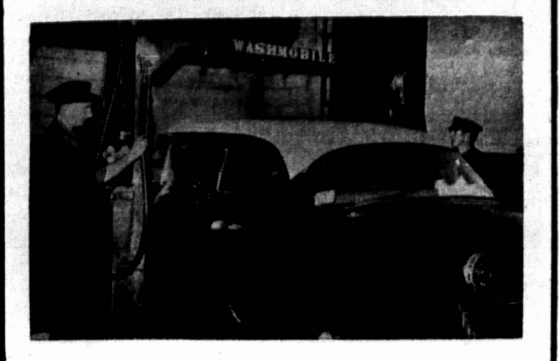

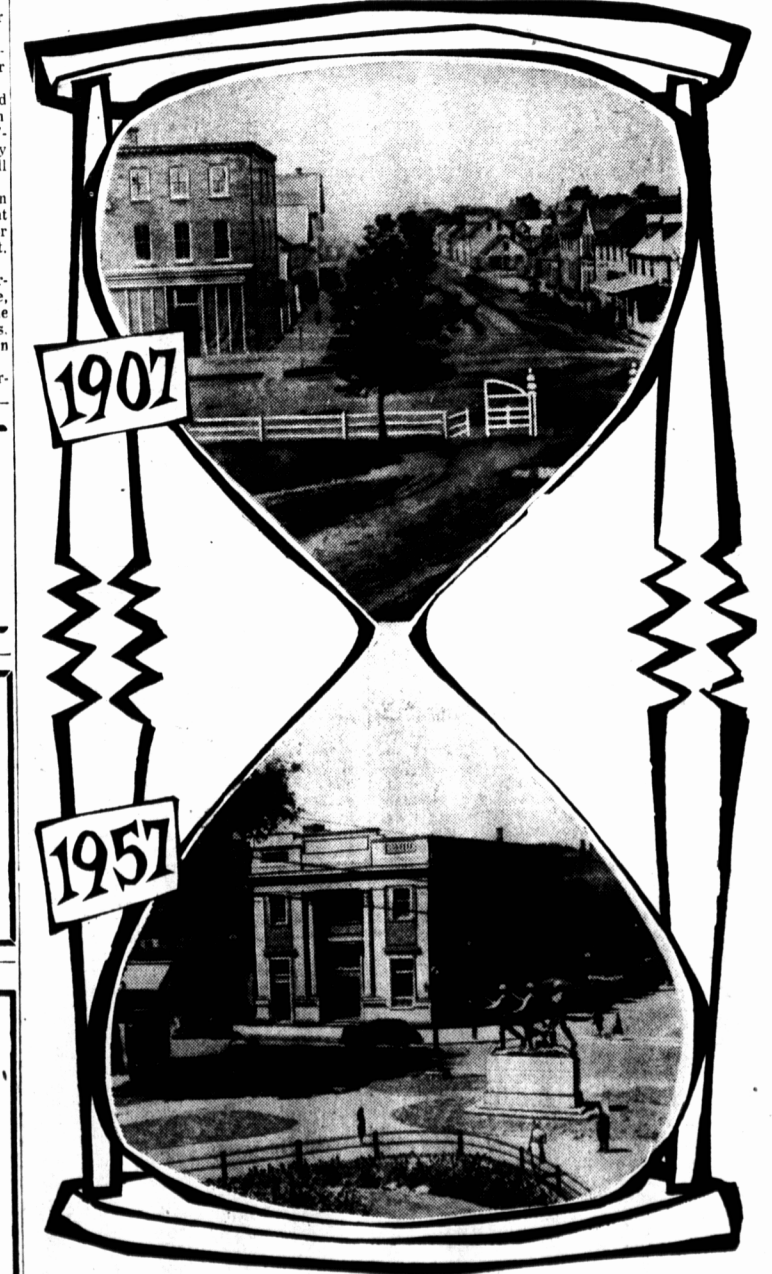
