

Canada's Mineral Output At Record High Last Year

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada's minerals dug a record \$1,454,000,000 worth of minerals out of the ground in 1954.

In its annual survey, the bureau of statistics estimated today that production, tripling in the last decade, jumped in 1954 by \$18,000,000 over the 1953 yield. All provinces shared in the increase.

Mineral production was one of Canada's economic highlights in 1954, helping to offset in part the effects on the national economy of the Prairie crop failure.

Big gains were shown for oil, copper, nickel and asbestos. Coal and zinc values declined.

The value of Canada's metals production, which includes copper, lead and zinc and runs from antimony to tungsten, rose by about \$54,000,000 to \$763,000,000 from \$709,000,000 in 1953.

With mine strikes settled, Canada's gold production rose by 221,000 fine ounces to 4,280,000, with value increasing by more than \$6,000,000 to \$145,800,000.

Copper production, encouraged by good demand and fairly high prices, jumped to 600,000,000 pounds from 506,500,000, with value increasing to \$174,000,000 from \$151,000,000.

Nickel rose by 32,700,000 pounds to 420,000,000 with value rising by almost \$20,000,000 to \$180,200,000. Lead production increased by 33,000,000 pounds to 442,500,000 with value rising by almost \$9,000,000 to \$59,000,000.

LESS ZINC
With new mines opening up in Quebec and Labrador, iron ore output jumped by 300,000 tons to 7,200,000. Value increased by \$2,600,000 to \$46,700,000.

Output of silver, by-product of many non-ferrous metal mines, increased by more than 3,000,000 ounces to 31,500,000, valued at \$28,280,000, up by about \$2,500,000 from 1953.

Zinc production, however, dropped by more than 55,000,000 pounds to 747,700,000 with values declining by \$6,800,000 to \$89,300,000.

Value of natural gas, oil and other fuels increase by \$50,000,000 to \$354,756,000. Crude oil production rose to 95,480,000 barrels from 80,898,000 with value rising to \$246,000,000, up \$45,500,000 from 1953.
