SOCCER PANTHERS SPLIT FIRST WEEKEND

THE UPEI SOCCER PANTHERS split their first two games of the 1987 season last weekend at McAdam Field. The Panthers lost 2-0 on Saturday to the powerful St. Mary's squad, but came back on Sunday to defeat St. Francis Xavier 3-1 and salvage a split.

In Saturday's game St. Mary's scored two goals in the first half of play and held off the Panthers the rest of the way for a 2-0 win. However the Panthers played very well especially in the second half as most of the butterflies had disappeared from the first half. St. Mary's lost very few players from last year's team, and those who did

leave were replaced by five players from Ontario.

On Sunday the Panthers played a team much like their own. St. Francis Xavier is also in a rebuilding season this year after losing a number of key players. The Panthers dominated the play on Sunday but fell behind in the first half as Rob Chaisson scored for the X-Men, but Richard Pierre-Giles evened the score at 1-1 when he scored with a shot from 25 yards out.

In the second half Pierre-Giles score the winner as he jumped on a Paulo Lombardi rebound from 18 yards out. Scott Ferrell scored the third goal

on a nice setup from Andrew Bartlett to round out the scoring.

When looking back at the weekend split, which saw UPEI lose its first regular season game in two years, Coach Andy Cameron was quite impressed. New goaltender Phil Muise played quite well in both games and appears to be handling the pressure of taking over from Trent Hayes. Cameron said the boys had much more confidence on Sunday and settled down to play a very good game of soccer.

Cameron used the same starting 11 in both games on the weekend. At back were Mike Blanchard, Jack Wheeler, Jamie Vessey, and David Vos. The midfielders were Paulo Lombardi, Peter Wolters, Andrew Bartlett, and Scott Ferrell. The forwards were Richard Pierre-Giles and Janos Barna. Mike Blanchard and Richard Pierre-Giles are the co-captains.

A bad note from Sunday's game was that back Mike Blanchard was carried from the field with a sprained ankle. Seven of the starting eleven now have nagging injuries.

Next action for the Panthers will be next weekend when they travel to New Brunswick for a pair of games against Mount Allison and the Universite de Moncton.

BASKETBALL— Two outdoor hoops have been put up on campus, one behind Bernardine and Marion Halls and one in front of Blanchard Hall. Basketballs are available in the residence. (Ask your resident Assistant).

ROADS— Walking and jogging route maps are available in the athletic department. Go for a walk or job before class, between classes, or after classes.
