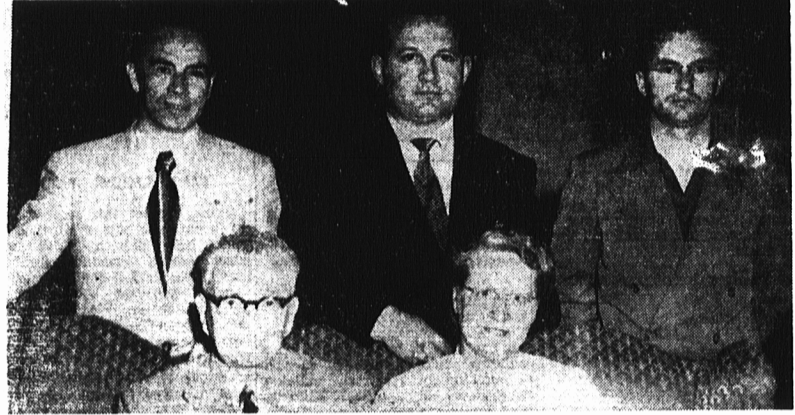
#### U. S. Promises Military Aid To Yugoslavia
