"There does not appear to be any legislation of a contentious nature coming up, and the session of the Legislature, which opens today will be quiet and fairly short," Premier Walter R. Shaw indicated yesterday.

With this being Centennial Year, it is expected the members will deal chiefly with business and keeping things moving rapidly. In recent years the Legislature has opened on Thursday, and then adjourned for the weekend.

This year's opening being on Tuesday, it is not expected to adjourn for Wednesday and all things will be held during the rest of the week.

Lieutenant-Governor W. J. MacDonald will open the session, reading his first speech from the Throne since his appointment last summer.

Mover of the Speech from the Throne will be Walter Dinevelt (P-2nd Kings), and the second will be Thomas Curran (P-2nd Kings).
