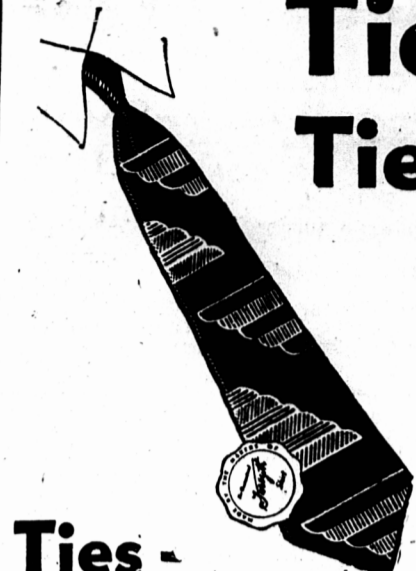

Giles Asked To Be National League President

CHICAGO, Sept. 26 (AP)—Warren Giles, who graciously stepped out of a stalemate with Ford Frick for baseball's commissioner-ship, today was graciously asked to become Frick's successor as president of the National League.

League vice-president Phil Wrigley of Chicago Cubs disclosed that the loop presidents all wanted Giles, 55, dignified No. 2 man of Cincinnati Reds, to accept Frick's \$40,000-a-year job at a meeting already set after the final World Series game.

Giles had no immediate comment.

"Mr. Giles is giving the matter serious consideration," said Wrigley in a statement, "and naturally we are all most anxious for him to accept as everyone must recognize that he is undoubtedly, from every angle, the best qualified man that we could get."

The owners kept giving Giles the same number of votes as Frick in the Sept. 20 balloting to name a man to baseball's top job, the \$65,000-a-year commissionership. That was until Giles withdrew and threw his full support behind Frick, who was not present at the Chicago meeting to select A. B. Chandler's successor.

Even as Frick was elected as commissioner, the rumor spread that Giles was a natural to replace him as league president.

Wrigley's statement said he had spent the last few days canvassing individual club presidents to get somebody to handle the league presidency because, even for a short while, the many and important details of the office couldn't be handled by himself in the "honorary" position as league vice-president.

Wrigley said all the presidents authorized him to ask Giles to take the job. Powell Crosley, Jr., owner of the Reds said: "It is up to Warren. As far as the ball club is concerned he is free to make up his own mind."

Players Selected For Annual NHL All-Star Game

NEW YORK, Sept. 26 (AP)—The Board of Governors of the National Hockey League selected additional players today for the fifth annual All-Star game to be played Oct. 9 in Toronto.

In four previous all-star games, the Stanley Cup champions have played the all-star team as chosen each spring by the hockey writers.

However, the game this year will be played between the first and second all-star teams—both chosen by the writers. The subs were chosen by the governors.

The writers named this first team: Terry Sawchuk, Detroit, goalie; Bill Quackenbush, Boston, and Red Kelly, Detroit, defence; Milt Schmidt, Boston, centre; and Ted Lindsay and Gordie Howe, both Detroit, wings.

The second team is Chuck Rayner, New York, goalie; Leo Reise, Detroit, and Jim Thomson, Toronto, defence; a tie between Ted Kennedy, Toronto, and Sid Abel, Detroit, for centre; Sid Smith and Maurice Richard, both Montreal, wings.

Others named to the first squad are Harry Lumley, Bill Gadsby, Lee Fogolin, Roy Conacher, Pete Babando, and Doug Bentley, Chicago; Alan Stanley, Don Raleigh and Reggie Sinclair, New York; and Johnny Peirson and Ed Sandford, Boston.

The governors picked these subs for the second team: Gerry McNeil, Doug Harvey, Butch Bouchard, Paul Meger and Floyd Curry, Montreal; Gus Mortson, Max Bentley, Harry Watson and Tod Sloan, Toronto.

Joe Primeau of Toronto will coach the first team, Dick Irvin of Montreal, the second.

Two-thirds of the gross receipts go to the players' pension fund.
