INDICT POLICEMEN

DETROIT (AP) — Seventeen city policemen now are under indictment on charges of lying about alleged gifts of money and liquor from bar owners. The one-man grand jury of circuit Judge Edward Piggins has accused eight policemen of perjury. The grand jury indicted nine officers on similar charges earlier. All 17 are under suspension pending court hearings.

Membership up across Canada

In spite of declining farm-population 4-H Club membership in Canada has increased nearly 12 per cent over a five-year period ending in 1964. During the same period club numbers increased by 667 clubs.

In 1965 members and clubs decreased by 1,415 members and 54 clubs dropped out. In part, the reasons for the decline in participation can be attributed to reorganization of programs in some of the provinces, and an unusually large turnover of professional 4-H staff. In 1965, Prince Edward Island had 847 members enrolled in agricultural projects with 42 clubs functioning. In about 58 garment clubs there were about 900 members enrolled. Even though we can offer such statistics we must bear in mind an important part: 4-H is the development of initiative and responsibility by each member. This, it must be admitted, is beyond being measured by numbers.

One of the noticeable features of 4-H is the club members project on the farm, in the home or in the community leadership. As a requirement of membership,

Are area and provincial councils of leaders necessary or useful? How can 4-H and other organizations complement each other's activities, especially in such programs as safety, community development, vocational training, etc. Where do we start?

Some prospect seen for strike settlement

LONDON (Reuters) — A new major concession by Britain's shipowners — nine day's extra leave a year — offered prospects of a settlement today in the crippling shipping strike, now in its sixth week.

The offer came unexpectedly Friday night after a marathon round of negotiations. The employers asked for increased productivity in exchange.

The union's 48-man executive was to consider the fresh proposal later today and hopes were high they would accept it and call off the stoppage.

Meanwhile, a British Channel ferry sailed from Dover, south-east England, to France early today — the first chink in the strike for 40 days.

The seamen's union allowed crew members to sail the ferry again.

after the owners agreed to meet full union demands for a 40-hour week.

The employers' new offer Friday night, made with obvious reluctance, added nine days to the 39 days paid leave recommended by a government-appointed court of inquiry into the dispute.

The union flatly rejected the court's finding.

Union approval of the employer's gesture would mean settlement of the strike this weekend, although it would be some days before clogged British ports began to operate again.
